FREE Continuing Education

Preceptors Core Modules - Module #1: The Role of the Preceptor

CE through the Collaborative Education Institute (CEI). This activity will provide you with 0.75 Hrs of CE. Learn about the potential benefits of precepting students and the common expectations students have of their preceptors.

Note: There are 4 Core Modules to help any preceptor improve their precepting skills, #1 focuses on the role of the preceptor and #2 on developing your rotation.

Preceptors Core Modules - Module #2: Developing Your Rotation

CE through the Collaborative Education Institute (CEI). This activity will provide you with 0.75 Hrs of CE, as well as tips on developing structure in your rotation in order to integrate your student into patient care activities and designing structured learning activities that enhance both the student and the rotation site.

CEI can be accessed directly by current preceptors through E*Value, the rotation management system used by UWSOP.

1. Access the E*Value login page via the following link: <https://www.e-value.net>
2. Log in to your E*Value account and click on the “Learning Modules” tab
3. Choose “CEI” within the submenu Taskbar
4. Click on “Connect to CEI Account” which takes you to the CEI Preceptor Education page
5. While there are many educational sessions available from CEI, to access the two core module sessions listed above, click on the light green “Preceptors” icon. The Core Modules are the first CE activities listed. You can register for free and complete the CE by following the on-screen prompts.

Elements of Rotation sample syllabus is a handout through CEI which provides guidance in creating or updating your rotation syllabus.
