APhA Advanced Preceptor Training

For those of you who are seasoned preceptors, this program will give you access to peer-developed content that will provide additional knowledge and tools to enhance your teaching, communication, clinical and interprofessional skills. For new preceptors, the training program will provide you with a strong foundation to get started in your new role as a preceptor.

The Advanced Preceptor Training program is available through the American Pharmacists Association (APhA). It is an online program that provides 13 hours of ACPE approved continuing pharmacy education (CPE) focused on enhancing preceptor skills. The program requires all preceptors to experience the same baseline education and then allows for self-assessment to identify your educational needs within the three remaining content tracks. The certificate of completion requires the prerequisite activities, plus any 10 activities. In addition to the 13 hours of CPE credit, you will have access to the entire preceptor content for 365 days from the day you started the material.

Collaborative Education Institute CE

Preceptors for the UWSoP have access to free CE through the Collaborative Education Institute (CEI). Access to the CE programs is through E*Value. Topics range from having crucial conversations

with students, fostering interprofessional educational opportunities, giving good feedback and much more. Activities range from 30 to 90 minutes.

CEI can be accessed directly by current preceptors through E*Value, the rotation management system used by UWSoP.

1. Access the E*Value login page via the following link: <https://www.e-value.net>
2. Log in to your E*Value account and click on the “Learning Modules” tab
3. Choose “CEI” within the submenu Taskbar
4. Click on “Connect to CEI Account” which takes you to the CEI Preceptor Education page
5. To access modules specific to preceptors, click on the round “Preceptor” icon. You can register for free and complete the CE by following the on-screen prompts.
