


Interpersonal-Psychological Theory of Suicidal Behavior

Desire for Suicide:

Perceived burdensomeness Low belongingness



"My death will be worth more than my life to family, friends, society, etc."





Interpersonal-Psychological Theory of Suicidal Behavior

Capability for Suicide:

A fearlessness of pain, injury, and death.



A clear implication of this is suicidal behavior.

Acquired through a process of repeatedly experiencing painful and otherwise provocative events.
