University of Wyoming requirements:

Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 to graduate. • Students must complete 42 hours of upper division (3000-level or above) coursework, 30 of which must be from the University of Wyoming. • Courses must be taken for a letter grade unless offered only for S/U. • University Studies Program (USP) Human Culture (H) and Physical & Natural World (PN) courses must be taken outside of the major subject, but can be cross-listed with the major.

Engineering & Applied Science Notes:

Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 in all Engineering courses for graduation. • A grade of C or higher is required for all prerequisite courses. Students must also achieve a grade of C or better in all required mathematics courses. • Academic plans and course schedules may need to be altered if Math Placement scores require MATH 0900, 0921, or 0925, and if so, students should be prepared for additional time to complete a degree.

- * Requires MATH ACT \geq 23, MATH SAT \geq 600, Math Placement Exam \geq 3, or concurrent enrollment in MATH 1400, 1405, or 1450. (University standard)
- ** Requires MATH ACT \geq 27, MATH SAT \geq 600, Math Placement Exam \geq 5, or \geq C in MATH 1405 or 1450. (University standard)
