Welcome and Approval of the Agenda and Minutes

Chairman Ron Harper called the meeting to order at 9:00 am. Tom Lockhart motioned and Paul Lang seconded the agenda and minutes be accepted. The motion was passed unanimously. (Agenda-Appendix A) (Minutes 5/25/07-Appendix B)

Introduction of SER Director, Mark Northam

Each council member and new Director, Mark Northam gave a brief introduction of themselves.

ERC and Director Roles and Responsibilities/Expectations

A discussion arose of expected meetings and updates that would be made by Northam. Rattie summed up his understanding laid out by the Governor that the Council's role is to be available to help the School of Energy succeed. Northam would like the ERC's advice for maximizing the financial gifts given to the school. Northam would like to use technology to communicate with the council regularly on the design of the new building. Wallace stated he would like to aid the school and Northam in the areas of wind energy.

It was determined that the Council would have scheduled quarterly meetings, with one of those being a conference call meeting, and updates from Northam in between. One of the quarterly meetings will be held in conjunction with the UW Board of Trustees.

ERC Membership and Leadership Selection Procedures

Chairman Harper stated he would write a position policy and get it out to all of the Council. It would be based on the election of ERC officers every two years. The question was raised on the filling of Mark Davies' position with his move to the U.K, and was answered by Representative Lockhart stating interim appointments can be made, but would ultimately need Senate approval. Lockhart provided information on how this process could work. (Appendix C) Ron Harper stated that he has had a discussion with the Governor with respect to a new appointment. The Governor expressed that he was looking at options.

Update of Professorship Searches

Northam gave an update on the ongoing searches for professorships including the hiring of mathematician, Felipe Pereira. Northam has just initiated a search for Chemistry, an Arid Lands Reclamation Ecologist, and a future wind specialist. Northam is also in hopes of including someone in Energy Policy to address land management issues. Start up packages for these positions must be competitive to attract essential candidates.

Update on NCAR

Myron Allen, VP of Academic Affairs, gave an update on the progress of the super computer. NCAR will be housed outside of Cheyenne, and is waiting for NSF funding to begin building.

Update on Academic Activity

One of Northam's top priorities will be in hiring an Academic Coordinator. Northam has enlisted the help of the Academic Council, and would like this to be a full time position, in hopes of a curriculum in place by fall of 2008.

Update on Matching Grant Funds

Pam Henderson gave an update on matching grant funds. (Appendix D)

Update on Fundraising

Chris Spooner from the Foundation gave an update. (Appendix E)

Update on Financial Report

Sarah Schulmeyer gave an update of expenditures through August 31, 2007. (Appendix F) Representative Lockhart raised his concern of SER becoming part of the "block grant" within the university at the end of this biennium. Rick Miller, VP of Govt. and Community Legal Affairs, stated that it was his understanding that SER would be a separate entity within the financial structure of the university.

Discussion of Drafted Annual Report

Northam will give an executive summary of the School of Energy's annual report to the Wyoming Minerals Committee on Wednesday, September 26. A motion was made by Tom Lockhart to accept the draft of the annual report, and seconded by Paul Lang. The report will be available on the School of Energy's website. www.uwyo.edu/ser/

Wyoming Infrastructure Authority

Steve Waddington from WIA requested the council to consider three items:

- That the ERC, along with Western Research Institute, and WIA put together a communication strategy to the public for the building of the infrastructure.
- That there would be collaboration on an RFP.
- That the Board of WIA meets with the ERC.

Chairman Harper stated the council would discuss these items and get back to him.

Action Items

Chairman Harper will write a position policy and distribute to council members.

Discussion with council about involvement of WIA.

A calendar will be drafted with 2008 meeting dates.

Future Meetings

The next ERC meeting will be in Laramie on Friday, November, 16. There will be a joint meeting with the University of Wyoming's Boart of Trustees in the morning session.

Tom Lockhart made a motion to adjourn the meeting, and Keith Rattie seconded it. The meeting adjourned at approximately 11:50.

Status of Director Search

Mark Northam has accepted the position of Director for the School of Energy Resources. He will start at the end of August, and there will be a press release soon.

Chairman Harper and the Energy Resource Council thanked Carol Frost for her hard work and all that she has accomplished in her term of Interim Director for the School of Energy Resources.

Myron Allen, VP of Academic Affairs, thanked the Council for their involvement as well.

Update on the Four Professorship Searches

Frost stated that formal letters had gone out to three of the candidates, and UW is waiting to hear their responses. The initial coal candidate has turned down his offer, making this

an ongoing search. Chairman Harper requested an update on these through the ERC bimonthly update.

Update on Academic Activities

Pam Henderson gave an update on the Energy Summer Institute which would occur June 10-22. ConocoPhillips would be attending a special session meeting with the high school students on June 13. Henderson will send council members the information on the luncheon planned.

Update on Research Center Development

The SER has provided seed funding to three of the SER research centers:

- Solar and Fuel Cells Group, SER Center for Renewable Energy Resources Proposal: Energy Nanoscience: solar cells, fuel cells, and energy storage
- <u>Sustained Biogenic Production of Coal-Bed Methane Group, SER Center for Coal Bed Natural Gas: Sustained Biogenic Production of Coal-Bed Methane</u>
- Wyoming Reclamation and Restoration Center, SER Center for Arid Lands <u>Restoration Ecology</u>: Mechanisms by which sagebrush facilities recovery of disturbed steppe ecosystems

Update on Fundraising

Ben Blalock gave an update on his meeting with Marathon and Anadarko. Both have stated that the School of Energy Resources can count on financial support. Blalock stated that Ultra has stated SER will have their financial partnership, and ConocoPhillips would provide a financial proposal this summer. BP America is preparing a meeting with the governor, and would announce their commitment to SER at that time. The coal industry will be the next area of funding partnerships the Foundation will embark on.

Update on ENR Activities

Director, Harold Bergman gave an introduction to the Ruckelshaus Institute of Environment and Natural Resources Institute and the Helga Otto Haub School of Environment and Natural Resources. Bergman discussed the school's mission and values, and the institute's interaction and cooperation with their Board.

Financial Report

The financial report was accepted. The question of how the budget would operate in the fiscal year of 2008 was discussed. Myron Allen responded by stating it would follow what is in the academic and financial plan.

Chairman Harper raised the question of what would occur with ERC members Mark Davies and Tom Stroock, whom were designated as one year members. Frost stated that the intention of the governor was to reappoint them.

Future Meetings

It was determined that the ERC would not meet again until the meeting in Laramie on September 21, with the option of Chairman Harper calling a teleconference meeting if necessary.

Keith Rattie requested the ERC prepare a resolution of gratitude to be given to the governor for Carol Frost's distinguished service.
