



AUDITORY LEARNERS

Best test type:
Writing responses to lectures they've heard; oral exams

Worst test type:
Reading passages and writing answers in a timed test




LEARNING SUGGESTIONS




- Use word association to remember facts and lines
- Record lectures and watch videos
- Repeat facts with eyes closed
- Participate in group discussions
- Record notes after writing them


CHARACTERISTICS




Tend to speak slowly, explain things well




Tend to be natural listeners




Tend to repeat things aloud



Think linearly



Read slowly



Prefer to hear, rather than read, information

If you are an auditory learner, you can try some of these strategies to improve your experience in class

- Try recording lectures
- Still take notes, but listening to the lecture again later will help you further understand the material
- Take notes using shorthand or abbreviations so you can listen more intently
- Sit closer to the front of the class
- Ask questions as you see fit
- Repeat formulas and key concepts to yourself when you study
- Read your text book out loud
- Do everything out loud
- Utilize study groups
