Worst test type:
Listen and respond tests




LEARNING SUGGESTIONS




- Draw or outline the information you need to remember
- Copy what's on the board
- Diagram sentences
- Take notes and make lists
- Color code, highlight, circle and underline words in your notes
- Use flashcards


CHARACTERISTICS




Tend to be fast talkers, may interrupt




Learn by seeing charts and diagrams




Need quiet study time



May think in pictures



Take detailed notes



Like to sit at the front of the class

If you are a visual learner, you should try some of the following strategies for improved performance in classes

- Take good notes and make sure they are organized in your three-ring binder
- Draw pictures and diagrams to help better grasp the concepts
- Notecards or flashcards can help you remember important formulas and concepts
- Rewrite your notes after class, especially the key points that were covered that day
- When you redo your notes, highlight key points or vocabulary
- Look at more than one textbook, maybe the pictures in a different book will help you connect to the concepts better
- Write in your book!
- Try color coding your notes
