

# Wyo wins title

**SUGARLOAF, Maine** — The University of Wyoming men's nordic ski team captured first place in the United States Collegiate Ski and Snowboard Association (USC-SSA) Championships on Saturday.

Wyoming finished second behind Cornell in the final event, the 15-kilometer relay race. Cornell needed two other teams to place higher than the Cowboys to win the overall national title, but UW used its depth to secure the team's first-ever national title by just a single point.

UW finished the week with a team-low 62 points, just one point better than Cornell.

The UW women's team, which has won the USCSSA championships two of the past three seasons, finished in second place for the second consecutive season. St. Olaf won the women's national title with 52 points, 10 better than the UW Cowgirls.

UW women skiers receiving individual combined All-American status were Kari Boroff, Erin Hammer, Liz Turner, Katie Turner and Aubree Haffee.

Receiving honors for the men's team were Justin Daraie, Riley Hopeman, Joe Howdyshell and Josh Peterson.
