AD Report

- Considering E-sports as a student recruitment tool. Wants to know more about it and decide if UW wants to participate.
- Financially it has been a rough year
 - BK and FB way down
 - Increased match from \$4M to \$5M
- Legislative updates
 - Pool improvements weren't approved
 - West Stands and pressbox improvement's weren't approved
- Conference Media Rights--will know who we're partnering with by summer.
 - Won't be able to control KO times as hoped
- Only have 5 contracted bowl games and MWC usually has 6 or more eligible teams
- Status of men's basketball--Coach Edwards will be back next year, but it'll be a critical year. He's doing everything right so AD Burman wants to give him another season.

Allegra's report about sexual assault issues from meeting with Pres. Nichols

- Suggestions from Pres:
 - Will have 2 SAs on the No More Task Force
 - Need to find funds for survivors' advocate for Athletics
 - Alyson and China will be included in group
 - 24% of SA's have been sexually assaulted at UW--this is a big problem
- SAAC looking for more community projects--Cowboy Easter egg hunt is being planned.
- Westies Awards will be May 5th
- There is a survivor' advocacy group available on campus per Taylor. Fliers are posted around campus and announcements going out electronically.

Subcommittee Reports

Academic Integrity—Aadland and Reiser

- UW success rates are nationally lower, but SA's have higher graduation rates than rest of UW student body.
 - 17 midyear grads
 - Ineligible--5 football
 - 10 on academic probation, mostly first-year students
 - With Michael's help, trying to get 1-credit courses as H courses. Does not have to go through USP committee if Ann Alexander approves them. Prefix will be UWYO.

- Two SA's are semifinalists for Tobin-Spitolari awards

Fiscal Integrity--Schuhmann (handout)

- Financial issues are more revenue based issues
- Fringe benefits tax went up to 56% from 51%
- CJC can offset some of these revenue deficits. Reserves will last another 2-3 years before more cuts are considered.
