LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENT:

In rating your oral and written German language proficiency, the Department of Secondary Education uses the scale developed by the American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages (ACTFL).

You must take the **OPI and WPT** and demonstrate that you have attained a score of **Advanced Low or better** on both assessments prior to enrollment in EDSE 4276 (Modern Languages Methods II). Note that the oral and written language proficiency requirements are mandated by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE).

STUDY ABROAD:

Studying abroad in a French-speaking country is **strongly recommended**. Students are encouraged to study abroad to attain the desired target language proficiency goal and to develop first-hand knowledge of francophone cultures. The **minimum** length of this experience should be **one semester or two summers, both in a structured language program, preferably in a home stay situation**.

A summer session **must be no shorter than a four-week intensive program** in order to be counted towards the study abroad requirement.

UW offers a variety of study-abroad programs. Consult with your academic advisor and with International Programs faculty for details.
