Joni Blake is the Executive Director of GWLA, a consortium of 31 research libraries in the central and western United States. Prior to joining GWLA, she served as the Associate Vice President for Academic Affairs at Stephens College in Columbia, Missouri, where she oversaw the library, archives, instructional technology, institutional research and accreditation. She holds a Ph.D. in Educational Leadership and Higher Educational Administration from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln and an M.A. in Library and Information Science from the University of Missouri-Columbia.

Richard W. Clement is Dean of Libraries and Adjunct Professor of History at Utah State University. He is the author of seven books and more than 40 scholarly articles. His most recent book, *Books on the Frontier: Print Culture in the American West, 1768-1875,* was published in 2003 by the University Press of New England and the Library of Congress. He is the founding president of the Mediterranean Studies Association and is co-editor of the journal Mediterranean Studies published by Manchester University Press. Before coming to USU, he was Head of the Department of Special Collections at the University of Kansas, where he was also Courtesy Professor of English and taught the History of the Book. He edited RBM: A Journal of Rare Books, Manuscripts and Cultural Heritage from 2003-2008. He was a Fulbright Educational Partnership Fellow in Peru in 2004 and received the Gretchen and Gene A. Budig Distinguished Librarian Award from the University of Kansas in 2003.

Martha Bedard was appointed Dean of the University Libraries at the University of New Mexico (UNM) on August 1, 2007. Professor Bedard came to UNM from Texas A&M University (TAMU), the 5th largest public university in the U.S. where she served in various leadership roles since 2000 including Associate Dean for Information and Collection Services. Prior to TAMU her positions included Associate Director for Library Services, University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill Health Sciences Library, as well as medical library directorships at Wake Medical Center in Raleigh NC, the Medical Center of Central Massachusetts in Worcester MA, and Lowell General Hospital in Lowell MA. Professor Bedard received a Bachelor of Arts, Cum Laude, from Fitchburg State College in Fitchburg MA, and a Master of Science in Library Science from Simmons Graduate School of Library and Information Science, Boston MA.



Collection Budget: Recent History

Beginning in 2005, UW undertook a major initiative to increase its library collections budget, through a multi-year plan involving legislative requests and tuition revenues. Since the initiative began, the collection budget has increased by a factor of 3.6.



Access Highlights

- UW Libraries, UW Law Library, and AHC maintain a central catalog and share membership in the Colorado Alliance of Research Libraries and OCLC (a worldwide consortium of research libraries).
- UW's Interlibrary Loan Office provides access to materials in over 7,000 libraries worldwide.
 Augmenting this access is Request It, a free online service that allows UW employees and students to request and receive materials electronically.
- The UW Libraries collaborate with the Wyoming State Library, Wyoming community colleges, and school and community libraries, through the Wyoming Library Database (WYLD) system.
- Many UW library resources are available to all citizens of Wyoming.
