THE UNIVERSITY OF WYOMING MINUTES OF THE TRUSTEES

July 1, 1940

For the confidential information of the Board of Trustee

A meeting of the Trustees of the University of Wyoming was called to order Roll call at 10:00 a.m. July 1, by President Bond. The following answered roll call: Mrs. Grieve, Mr. Bond, Mr. Marshall, Mr. Facinelli, Mr. Linn, Mr. Barrett, Mr. Sill, Governor Smith and President Crane.

Mr. Marshall moved that the action of the Executive Committee to further the National Defense program be approved and that President Crane is Summer Pilot authorized to enter into a contract with the Federal Government for the Summer Pilot Training Program and that we continue the authority given to the President of the Board to call a special meeting of the Board if necessary. This motion was seconded by Mr. Barrett and carried.

Then followed a discussion of the renewal of contracts for Miss Reid and Miss Gunderson. Dean Schwiering came in. Mrs. Grieve moved that Miss Reid and Miss Gunderson, be informed that there had been discussion of renewal of their contracts; that the Board approves the recommendation of Dean Schwiering for the renewal; that the Dean inform them that there must be no further criticism and that reelection is not a complete exoneration. This motion was seconded by Mr. Barrett and carried.

Mr. Barrett moved that Arthur Schweitzer be reappointed visiting instructor in Economics at the same salary. This motion was seconded by Mr. Marshall and carried.

Mr. Facinelli moved that Francis W. Weitzmann, Associate Professor of English, be granted a year's leave of absence without pay, his return to the University to be on the call of the instition. This motion was seconded by Mr. Barrett and carried.

Mr. Linn moved that the contract of Mr. R. L. Markley, Assistant Professor of Physical Education and Acting Director of the Department of Physical Education, be not renewed. This motion was seconded by Mr. Facinelli and carried.

Mr. Sill moved that Dr. S. H. Knight, Chairman of the Department of Geology, be granted Sabbatical leave for the Fall and Winter Quarters of 1940-41. This motion was seconded by Mr. Facinelli and carried.

It was moved by Mr. Facinelli, seconded by Mr. Marshall and carried that Mr. Glen Hartman, Associate Professor of Agronomy, be given leave without pay, for the period from August 21, 1940 to August 20, 1941, in order that he may continue to serve as State Representative of the Bureau of Agricultural Economics.

WHEREAS the Trustees of the University of Wyoming have heretofore Bonds for Women's Mr. Facinelli moved approval of the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Barrett and carried:

authorized the issuance of a series of bonds in the aggregate principal amount Dormi of \$240,000.00 for the purpose of constructing, furnishing and equipping a women's dormitory on the campus of the University of Wyoming at Laramie pursuant to Chapter 119 of the Session Laws of Wyoming 1939, and

WHEREAS said bonds constitute a direct lien and charge upon the income derived from rentals collected for the use of rooms in said building:

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the income derived from the rental for use of rooms in said dormitory sufficient tomeet amortization payment thereunder as they become due is hereby pledged for the repayment of said bonds both as to principal and interest, and that said bonds, both as to principal and interest, shall constitute a direct lien and charge thereon.

Then followed a report of the Retirement Committee. Dean Arnold, Dean Schwiering and Mr. Fuller came in. After discussion, Mr. Marshall moved that no University funds are involved in payment of premiums under this

proposed retirement plan, that the President is authorized to expend not to exceed \$350.00 for the services of an Insurance expert if, in the opinion of the Attorney General, such an expenditure is legal. This motion was seconded by Mr. Barrett and carried.

President Bond and President Crane then reviewed several requests for advertisements in special editions of newspapers. Mr. Linn moved that we reaffirm our former stand against paid advertising. Mr. Barrett seconded the motion and it was carried.

Professor Sink and Dean Goodrich appeared before the Board for a discussion of the renewal of Professor Sink's contract. At the request of President Bond Mr. Barrett presided. After the discussion and a hearing during which several witnesses were interviewed, President Bond resumed the chair. Mr. Barrett moved that we find the charges against Professor Sink have not been substantiated; that we continue his employment without contract; that Doctor Crane be instructed to advise Professor Sink that there are many things in the evidence that do not appeal to the Board; that he try to find other employment in the near future; and that he try to improve his relationship with other members of the faculty. This motion was seconded by Mr. Sill and carried.

Mr. Okie Blanchard then appeared before the Board to ask permission to construct an athletic dormitory. Mr. Facinelli moved that the President Gthletic Porw. of the University be given authority to seek legal opinion as to the validity of our actions and, if valid, through him grant authority for the erection on the campus of an athletic dormitory, in accordance with plans submitted and that we, in turn, contract to lease or purchase over a period of five years at a charge not to exceed \$200.00 monthly. This motion was seconded by Mr. Sill and carried.

Mr. Marshall moved that Mr. George F. Gerling, Assistant Professor of English and University Editor, be granted Sabbatical leave for the Fall and Winter Quarters of 1940-41 on the usual Sabbatical leave terms, and leave without pay for the Spring quarter of that year. This motion was seconded by Mr. Barrett and carried.

Mr. Marshall moved approval of the following reappointments which had been held by request of the State Department of Education pending negotiations under the Smith Hughes Act.

Mr. Linn moved that the proper University officers take out liability Insurance on Science Camp insurance in the amount of \$5,000.00 to \$10,000.00 for 90 days on the Cars. various University cars assigned to Science Camp. The policy is to carry \$5,000.00 property damage. Meanwhile University officers will investigate and report to the Board at the next meeting the possiblity of insurance for all motor equipment. This salary will be divided in accordance with services rendered as Mr. Davis will continue his summer duties as Manager of the University camp. This motion was seconded by Mr. Marshall and carried.
