NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

The Trustees of The University of Wyoming do approve as the site for the construction of a facility to meet space needs of the Wyoming Geological Survey that area immediately adjacent to the north and to the east of the Geology and Geology Museum Buildings as may be more specifically described by mututal agreement with regard to space needs and design, provided that such site designation shall terminate on September 1, 1976 if a mutual agreement pertaining to the construction, use, and other rights of the parties has not been adopted and funds for construction have not been provided.
