Du, Min

Associate Professor

Professor Du's (Ph.D., Iowa State University, 2001) responsibilities include performing research in muscle biology and meat science, teaching and advising of undergraduate and graduate students in Animal Science, and providing professional services. His research is focused on the molecular mechanisms controlling skeletal muscle growth and meat quality, especially fetal skeletal muscle growth and development. He has established a competitive research program in Muscle Biology and Meat Science as manifested by four USDA-NRI awards and one NIH R03 award as the principal investigator received during his tenure at UW. He has published more than seventy peer-reviewed publications and sixty meeting abstracts and invited speeches.

Surovell, Todd A.

Associate Professor

Professor Surovell (Ph.D., University of Arizona, Tucson, 2003) was appointed to the Anthropology faculty in 2003. An expert in the ancient peoples of this region, Dr. Surovell is known for applying quantitative modeling to the archaeological record. He has a book "Toward a Behavioral Ecology of Lithic Technology" (University of Arizona Press) coming out this year as well as a variety of articles in such publications as the Proceedings of the National Academic of Sciences and Geoarchaeology. He teaches classes on Old World Archaeology, Archaeological Science (for non-majors), and Geoarchaeology. He and colleagues received an NSF grant for their work in 2005.

Waguespack, Nicole M.

Associate Professor

Professor Waguespack (Ph.D., University of Arizona, Tucson, 2003) was appointed to the Anthropology faculty in 2003. An expert in the ancient peoples and animals of this region, Dr. Waguespack has published in such premier journals as the American Anthropologist and American Antiquity. She is an archaeologist who teaches a diverse array of classes including the introductory course, anthropology's capstone course, and an upper division class for those outside the major. In addition to her role as director of the graduate program, she has been featured in a variety of archaeology-related television programs on the Discovery and History Channels.

Associate Professor

Professor Basile (Ph.D., Purdue University, W. Lafayette, IN, 1992) was appointed to the Chemistry faculty in 2003. As the principal investigator, Dr. Basile recently received a three year grant from the Department of Defense for nearly a million dollars. He was awarded the prestigious CAREER award by the National Science Foundation. He also has been a collaborator on a variety of other grants and among others, published several refereed articles in the Journal of Proteome Research. He teaches instrumental analysis and mass spectrometry to graduate and undergraduate students. In addition to his UW activities, he volunteers for the Big Brothers-Big Sisters organization.

Associate Professor

Professor Hsu (Ph.D., Washington State University, Pullman, WA, 2002) was appointed to the Communication & Journalism faculty in 2003. Dr. Hsu has published in the research areas of intercultural communication and communication apprehension. She teaches a variety of courses to undergraduate and graduate students on communication research methods especially quantitative methods and nonverbal communication.

Knieval, Michael S.

Associate Professor

Professor Knieval (Ph.D., Texas Tech University, Lubbock, TX, 2002) was appointed to the English faculty in 2002. Dr. Knieval publishes in the areas of technical writing, rhetoric and composition, and the use of technology in writing. He received the "A&S Extraordinary Merit in Teaching" award in 2005. His courses range the gamut from the freshman level English composition for the Synergy program to professional writing and practicum in college teaching. He is active in the English Department's Writing Programs Committee. He consults for Trihydro Corporation, an environmental company in Laramie.

Department of Geology & Geophysics

Shuman, Bryan N.

Associate Professor

Professor Shuman (Ph.D., Brown University, Providence, RI, 2001) was appointed to the Geology & Geophysics faculty in 2007. An expert in the area of climate change and pollen analysis, Dr. Shuman is taking the lead in the development of a new interdisciplinary Center for Quaternary Studies at UW in which affiliated researchers will study the last 100,000 years. Dr. Shuman was awarded the prestigious five year CAREER award by the National Science Foundation for his project, "Effects of Prolonged Droughts, Severe Fires, and Forest Parasites on Regional Ecosystem Pattern in the Rocky Mountains over the past 5,000 Years. He teaches courses on the physical environment of the earth and geological perspectives on water, among others.

Department of Mathematics

Stanescu, Dan

Associate Professor

Professor Stanescu (Ph.D., Concordia University; Montreal, Quebec, Canada, 1999) was appointed to the Mathematics faculty in 2003. Dr. Stanescu has been instrumental in developing a new undergraduate minor in computational sciences, an interdisciplinary direction with much potential. He has received several grants from the National Science Foundation since arriving at UW. Moving from a background in engineering, he has recently published in the area of the application of mathematics to biological processes. His courses range from the 2000 level in calculus and linear algebra to the graduate level in computational methods and numerical analysis.

Associate Professor

Professor Moffett (Ph.D., University of Colorado, Boulder, 2003) was appointed to the Philosophy faculty in 2003. Dr. Moffett is the co-editor of a forthcoming volume from Oxford University Press, *Know How: Essays on Knowledge*. He publishes on a variety of topics including epistemology, the philosophy of language and cognitive complexity. His courses range from the introductory to the graduate levels, including the "Introduction to Philosophy," "Theories of Knowledge," and "Metaphysics" and is the Philosophy Club mentor. He received an A&S Extraordinary Merit in Research award in 2007.

Professor Anderson (Ph.D., University of Cambridge, England, 1996) was appointed to the Political Science faculty in 2005. Dr. Anderson's recent book, *Crafting the European Union's Security Policy: In Pursuit of a European Identity*, was published by Lynne Rienner Publishers in 2008. She also has published other articles and book chapters on the European Union. Serving on the Women's Studies Advisory Committee, the International Studies Committee and the European Studies Committee, she is well respected by students and received the "Top Prof" award in 2008 from UW's Chapter of Mortar Board. In addition to her other classes, she supervises students who are involved in the model United Nations program.

Professor Skopek (Ph.D., Texas Tech University Lubbock, TX, 2000) was appointed to the Political Science faculty in 2003. In 2008 Dr. Skopek received the Hollon Family Award for Teaching Excellence in Off-Campus Programs, one of UW's highest teaching honors. Administering the Master's in Public Administration for Political Science, she regularly advises nearly 60 graduate students and supervises their graduate papers in many cases as well as teaching much of their coursework. Her published research ranges from studies of Native American gaming to governmental decision making at various levels.

Additional research projects currently underway include the following: An Attachment Based Approach to Training Resident Child Care Staff Working With Adolescents: A Qualitative Exploration; Growing Up Black in Rural White America: A Critical Race Theory Perspective; Individual Supervision and Triadic Supervision: Perceptions, Experiences and Effectiveness; and An Examination of the Relationship Between Attachment and Supervisee and Supervisor Relations in Counselor Education Training.

Associate Professor

Professor Wang received his PhD in meteorology at the University of Utah, and, before joining the faculty of the Department of Atmospheric Science in 2004, was a research scientist at the University of Maryland and NASA Goddard Space Flight Center. He is well known for his synthesis of satellite and surface-based remote sensing observations to further our understanding of clouds and their influence on weather and the global energy balance. At UW, his development of complex lidar systems for use on the UW research aircraft has become nationally and internationally recognized. Professor Wang was recently honored with the very prestigious NSF 5-year CAREER award. At NASA, he received the Group Achievement Award as part of the CloudSat development team, and has twice received Award of Science and Technology Advances from the Chinese Academy of Science.

Associate Professor

Professor Tanner (Ph.D. UT Austin, TX, 2003) was appointed to the Civil and Architectural Engineering faculty in 2003. She is a member of the national masonry code committee and secretary of two concrete committees. Her research areas include concrete, masonry, small and large scale experimental testing and earthquake engineering.
