We have some new antennas at our club station. NQ7Q Wayne, KD7W Doug, N7JT Jerry, and AF7E Bill went through all of the antennas at the N7UW site and updated old antennas, and installed a new antenna at our station. A quick look at the Union roof will show a much neater and improved array of HF antennas. We now have a 160 meter inverted vee about 60 feet above the roof, an 80 meter dipole, a 40 meter delta loop, and a 10 meter sloper at about 40 feet above the roof. These antennas are all tuned and ready for operation! We also cleaned out a lot of old coax and connectors that were in place but not functional. These antennas are for our clubs use, why not take advantage of them, I intend too. We also made an inspection of the tower and guys. All is in order for the (ugh!) up and coming winter. Enjoy!

UARC MINUTES FOR MAY 1, 2001

CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order by President Bill AF7E at 7:30 PM in Room 2101 of the Engineering Building. All officers were present; 17 members and two guests were in attendance and introduced themselves by call sign. A sign-in sheet was circulated. This was the last meeting before the summer hiatus.

Those in attendance were: Bill AF7E, Rhett, ND7O, Jim N7SPH, Paul W7MO, Lynn KB7SGP, Jim KD7KMU, Jerry N7JT, Fred KS7Q, Dick KD7FHE, Bob WS7C, John K7HPL, Brent KC0FUP, Suzanne KD7NAF (potential new member), Wayne NQ7Q, Doug KD7W, Tony KD7TA and son Simon (no call yet), Barry KB7VQV, and Bill N7SXC.

MINUTES OF LAST MEETING: The minutes as published in the May issue of Code of the West (COTW) were presented. It was moved and seconded that the minutes of the April 3, 2001 meeting be accepted as published. The motion carried unanimously by vote of membership and the minutes were filed accordingly.

COMMUNICATIONS: None were received.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Tony KD7TA reported a treasury balance of \$689.89 as of May 1, 2002. Activity during the month included an \$18 deposit for dues, a \$300 check for purchase of a new HF rig for the club was issued, and a phone bill which will be paid upon receipt. A balance of \$260 was reported in the repeater repair/maintenance fund.

No other bills against the club were reported.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

1. COTW: Wayne NQ7Q asked for articles for the September, 2001 issue which will be prepared in late August.
2. VE exams: Jerry N7JT reported giving 4 exams, with Jim N7SPH passing the exam for Extra class, Suzanne KD7NAF passing exam/code for the Technician class, John Harrison for Technician no code, and Laura KD7KMT passing requirements for Technician class with code.
3. Officer Election Committee was appointed by President AF7E: This summer, chairman Wayne NQ7Q and Jerry N7JT, and Mac WB7K will prepare a slate of candidates for elections to be held during the September meeting.

OLD/UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

1. New radio. Jerry N7JT purchased a new club rig, a Kenwood TS-130 with a 500HZ filter, from the Gaddis estate in Gillette for \$300.
2. Field Day: Chairman Jim N7SPH led in discussing preparations for this event (see discussion in place of a program)

NEW BUSINESS:

1. The next regularly scheduled meeting of UARC will be on September 4, same place and time.
2. A motion from the floor for the UARC officers to pay any normal bills during the summer was made and seconded. Upon unanimous vote of the membership, the motion passed and was adopted.
3. A question of tuners for UARC's two radios was raised by President Bill AF7E. We currently have one tuner and have need for another for the new radio. Wayne made a motion that we buy a tuner for the new rig, appointing Jerry N7JT to search for one this summer. The motion was seconded after establishing that we would set a financial limit of "Jerry's best judgment," and the motion carried unanimously by vote of the membership.

4. No other new business was discussed.

OTHER ANNOUNCEMENTS AND ACTIVITIES: None were reported.

DOOR PRIZES: Lynn KB7SGP won a year's subscription to World Radio.

ADJOURNMENT: A motion was made and seconded to adjourn, and on unanimous vote of the membership, the motion carried. The meeting adjourned at 7:43 PM, followed by a discussion of field day activities.

PROGRAM: Field Day Chairman Jim N7SPH led a discussion on particulars for the June 23 and 24 event.

If you are not blessed with lots of room for wire antennas, you might want to operate from the UARC station in the top of the tower on the Wyoming Student Union. Take someone familiar with the setup with you the first few times to figure out the routine, and operate from there. You will be happy to note that we have a fine 10m dipole, 40m delta loop (which can be used on most bands above 40m with a tuner), an 80m dipole, and now a 160m inverted V. With contests and other activities this fall, we might even want to try some more club efforts. We even have hopes that we might be able to eventually reclaim one of the rooms lower down at the base of the ladder to allow easier access for our members. I plan to operate from the UARC station in the tower this winter, and I hope to see you there as well.
