Throughout this guide, illustrations of the Flickr Android app are marked with red arrows (), to help identify features of the app described in the step-by-step instructions.

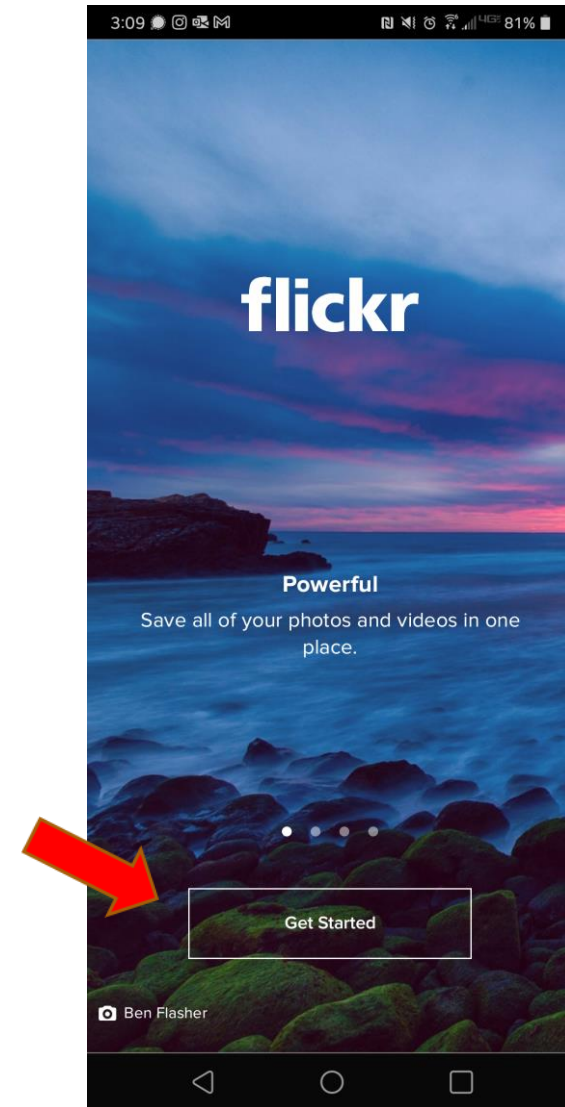
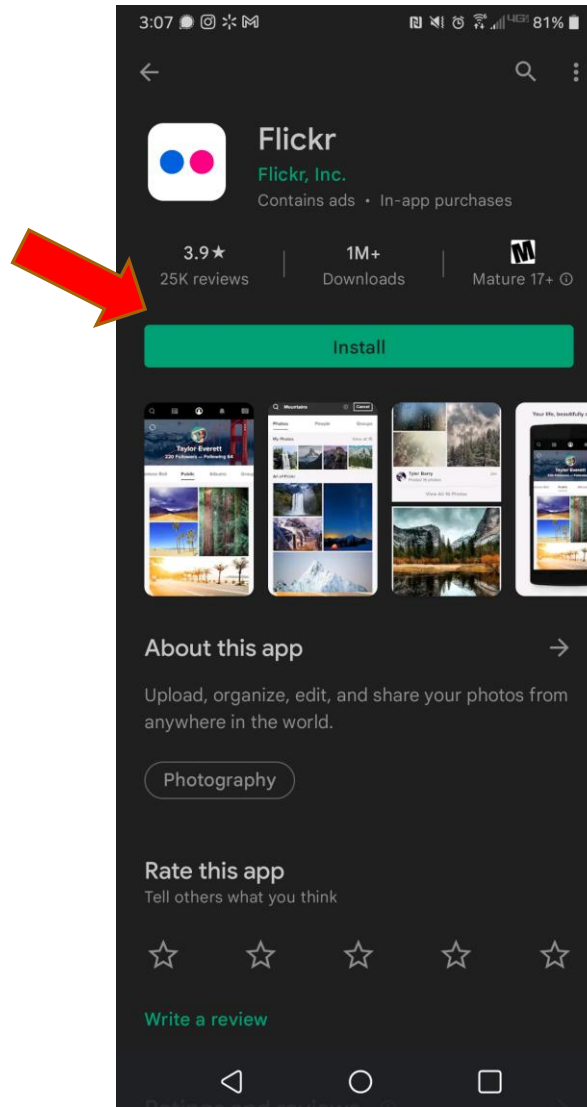

Installing Flickr

1. Search “Flickr” in the Play Store, then click “Install” to download the app and install it on your device.
2. Once installed, open the app and click “Get Started.”

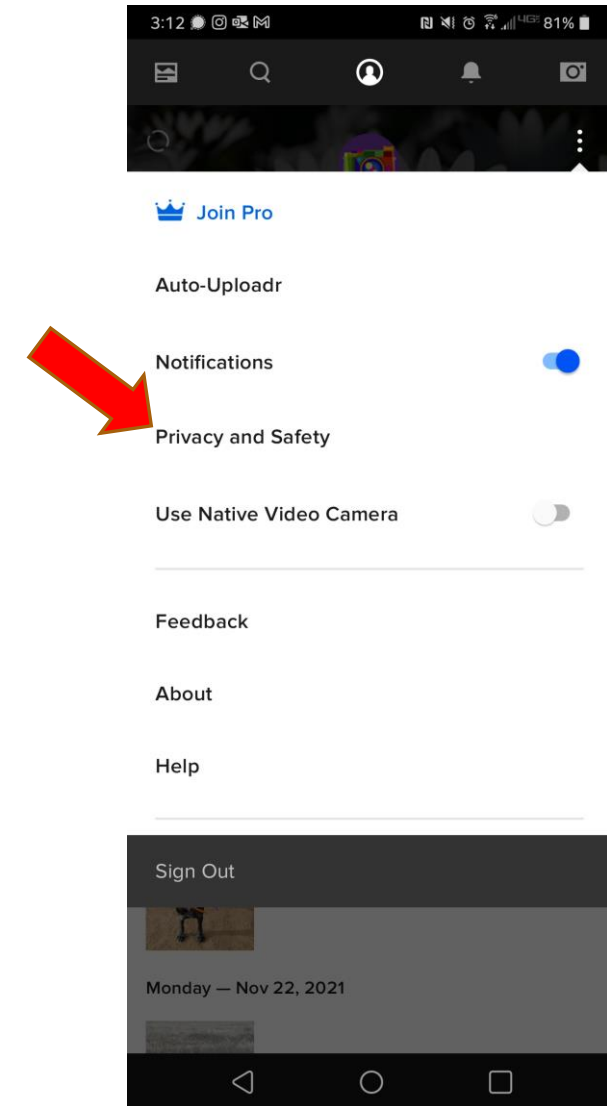
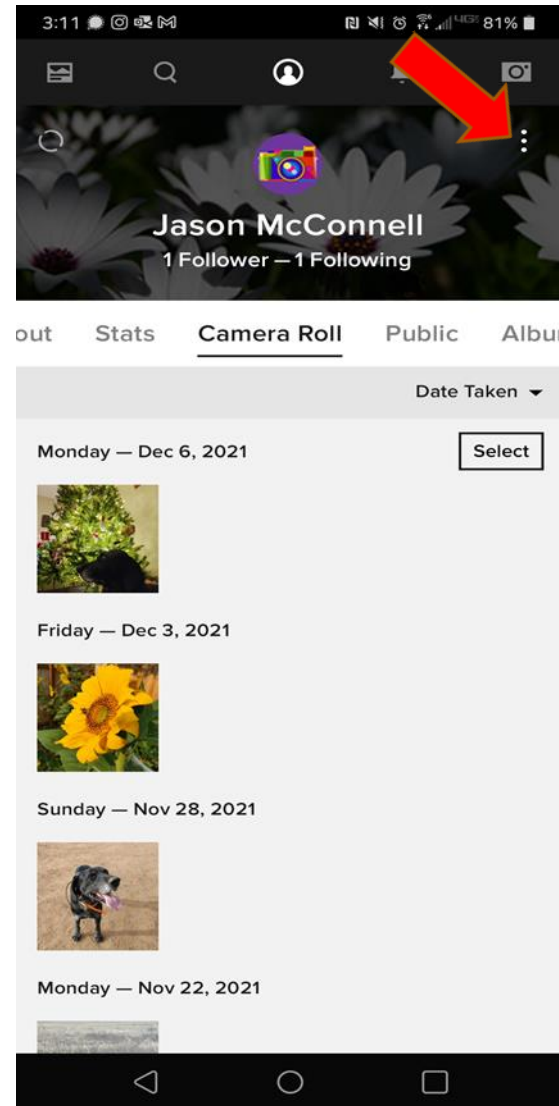
Your Profile

5. Once you have an account and you're signed in, you'll be taken to the homepage. Use the menu bar at the top of the page to navigate.
6. Click on the icon that looks like a person at the center of the menu bar located on the bottom of the page. This will take you to your profile. (see illustration right)



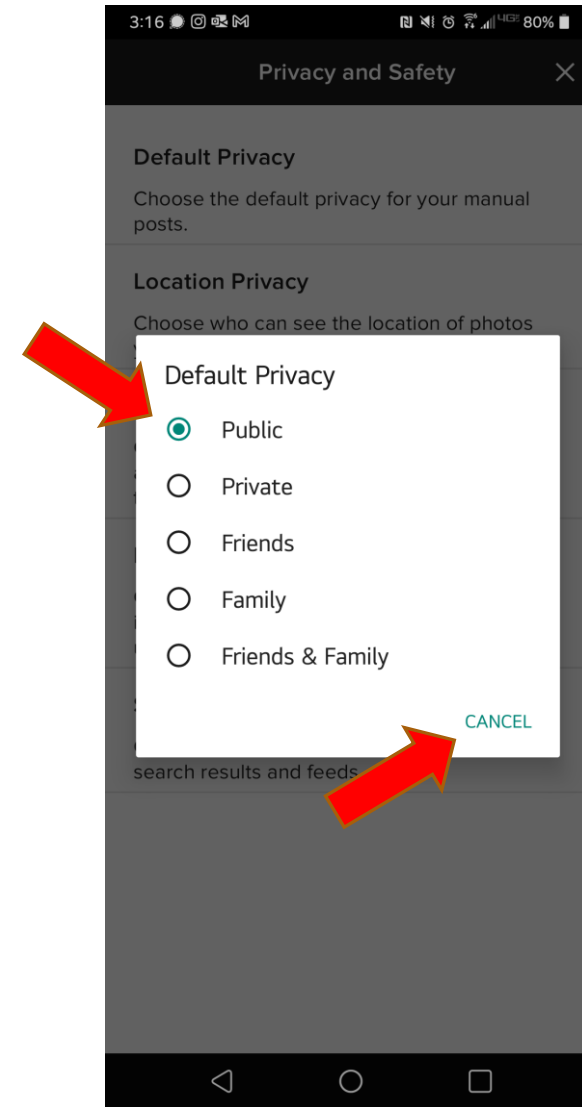
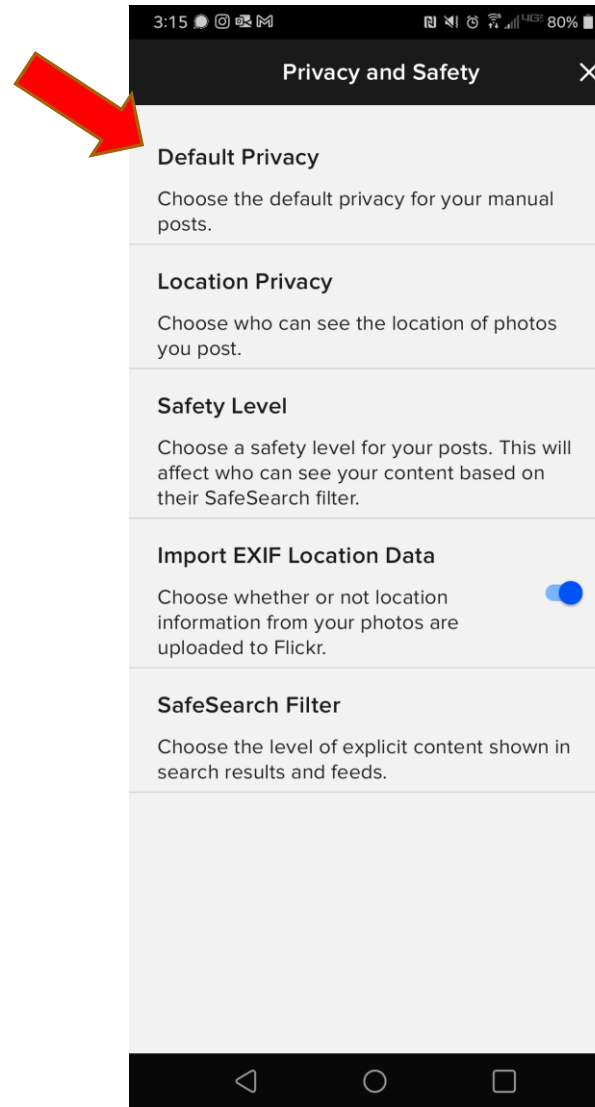
Privacy & Safety

7. Click on the rectangle icon with three dots, located on the upper right hand corner of your profile.
8. This will open a drop-down panel of options. Click on the third option from the top, "Privacy and safety."



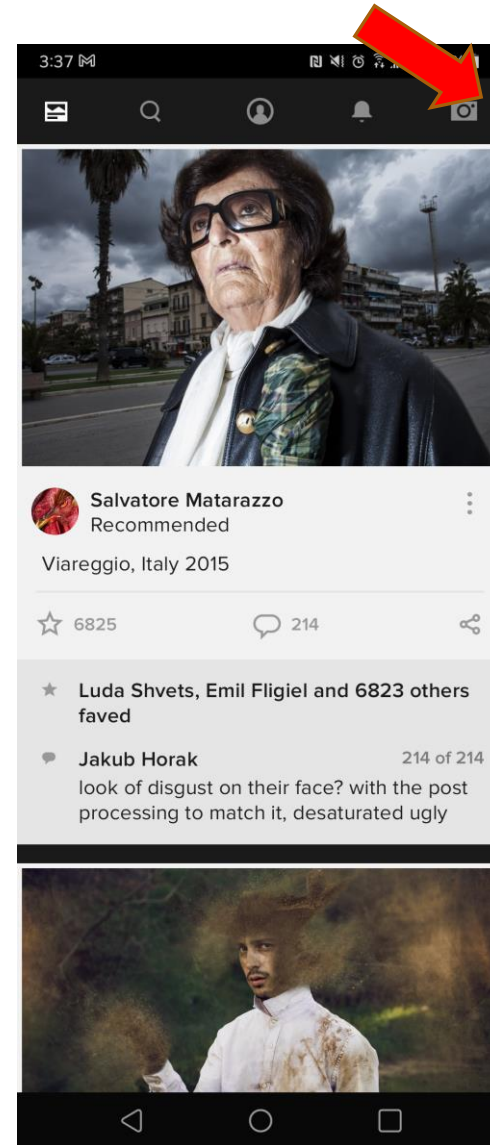

9. This opens a new window. The top option is “Default post privacy”- check that it says “Public”. This allows the Wallop team to view and download your contributions to the project.
10. Click “CANCEL” on the bottom right hand corner of that window to return to your profile page.



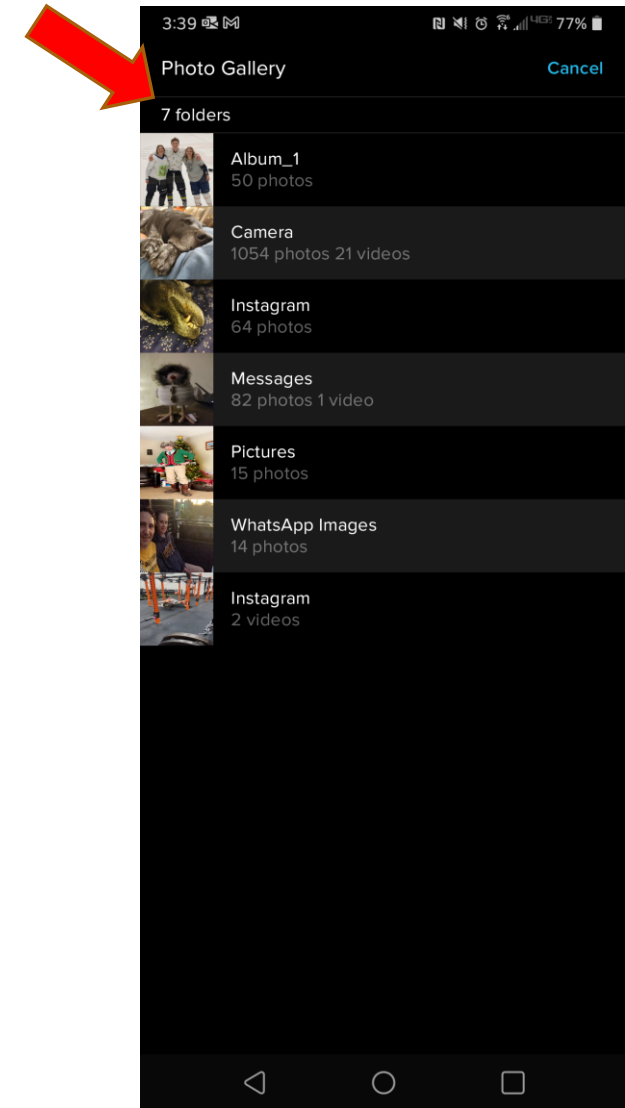
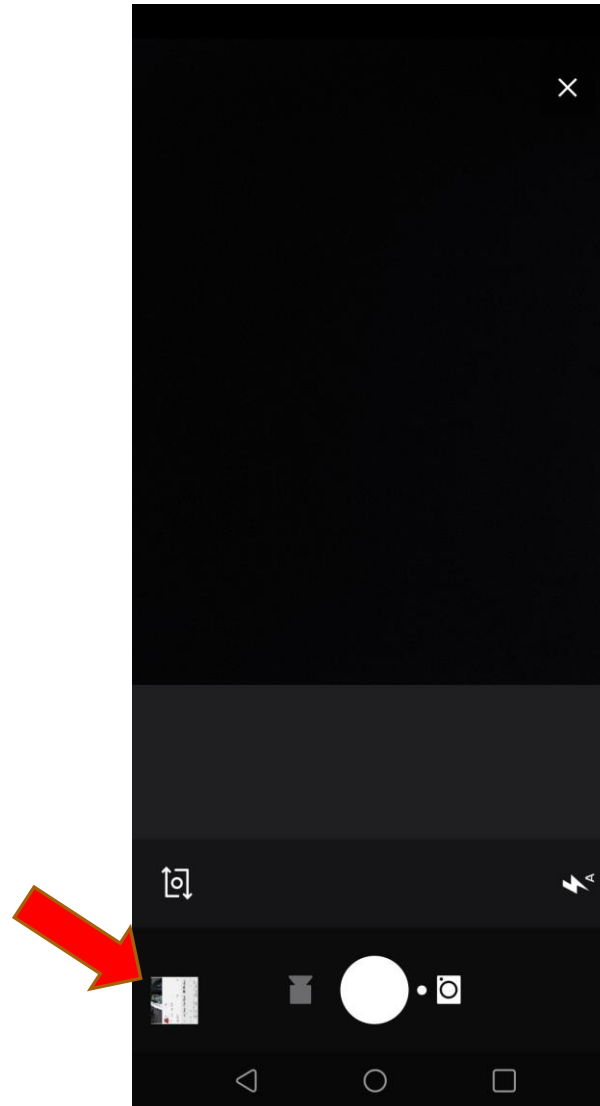
Adding Photos

11. To add photos to our project, click the “camera” button on the right of the menu bar.
12. You may be taken into your Android device settings to allow access to your photos. Allow Flickr to access “All photos” or “Select Photos”.



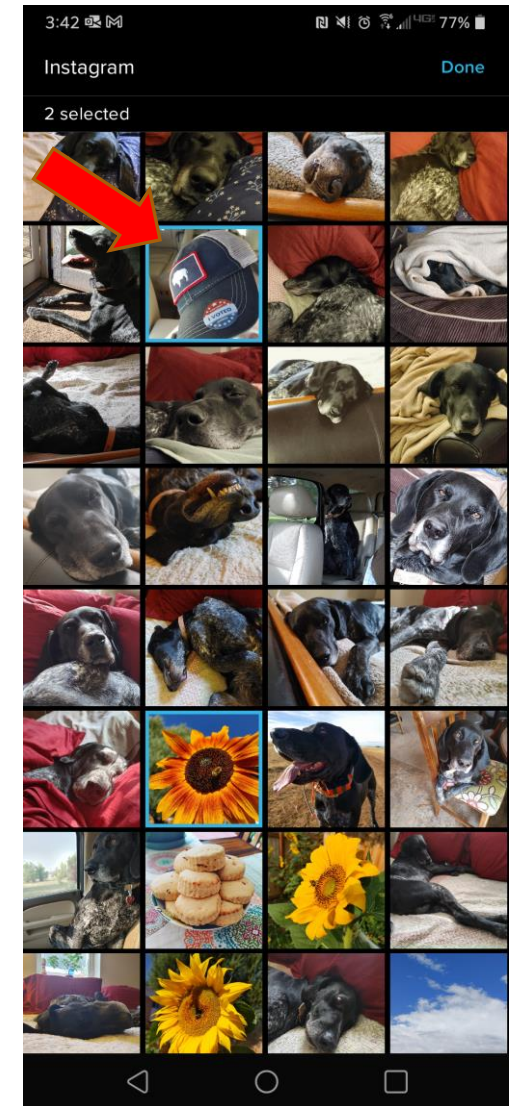
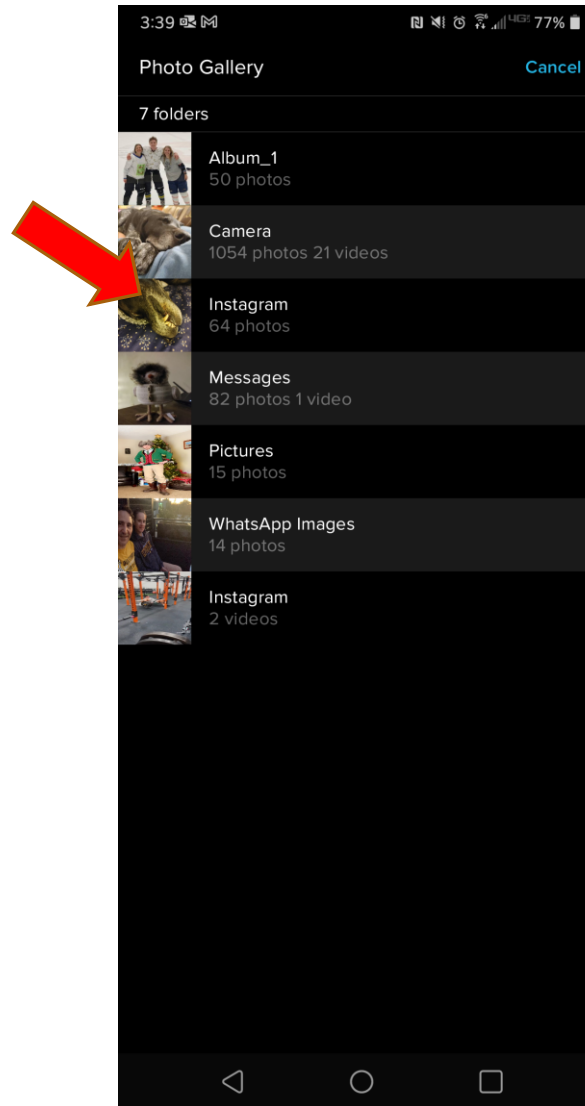
Adding Photos

13. Once your device's camera activates, you can now take photos directly through the Flickr app.
14. If you would like to add photos already stored on your Android device, click on the "gallery" icon in the lower left hand corner.
15. This opens your device's Photo Gallery, listing all available folders of images.



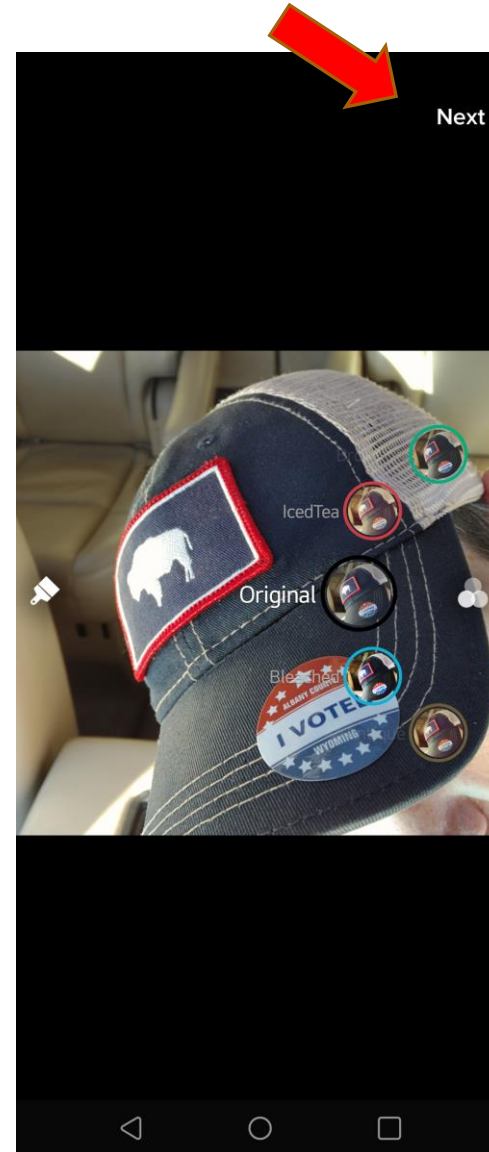
Adding Photos

16. Choose which folder contains the photos you would like to upload, by clicking on the folder.
17. Select which photos you'd like to share with us by clicking on them and then hitting the "Done" button in the upper right corner.



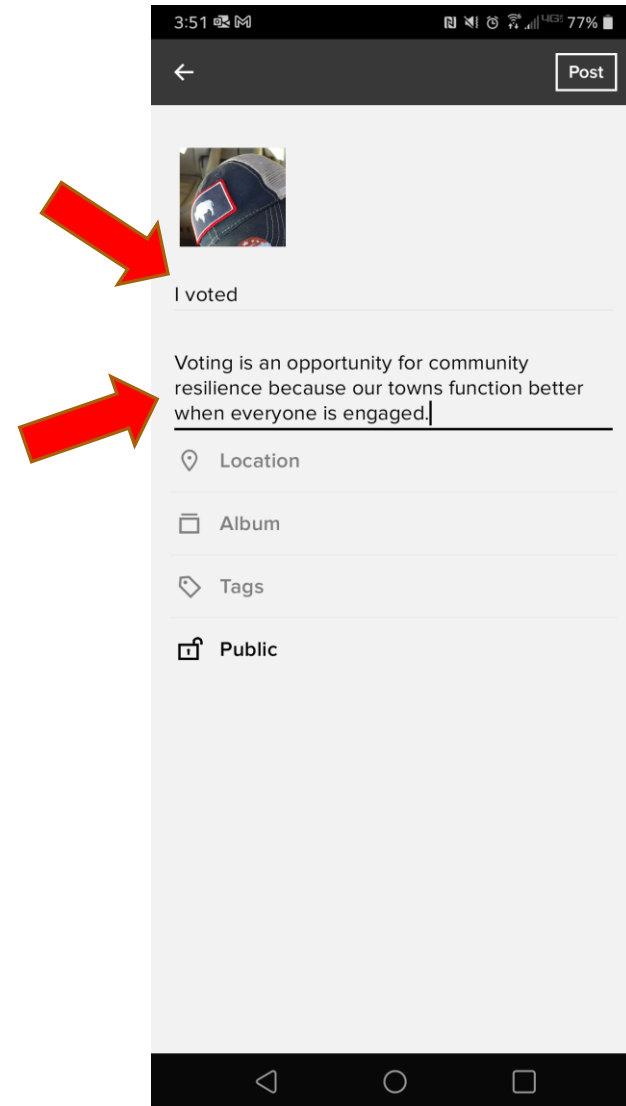
Adding Photos

18. You will be taken to an “Editor” page where you can adjust lighting or add a filter. You do not need to do this, however.
19. To post this photo, hit the “Next” button in the upper right hand corner.



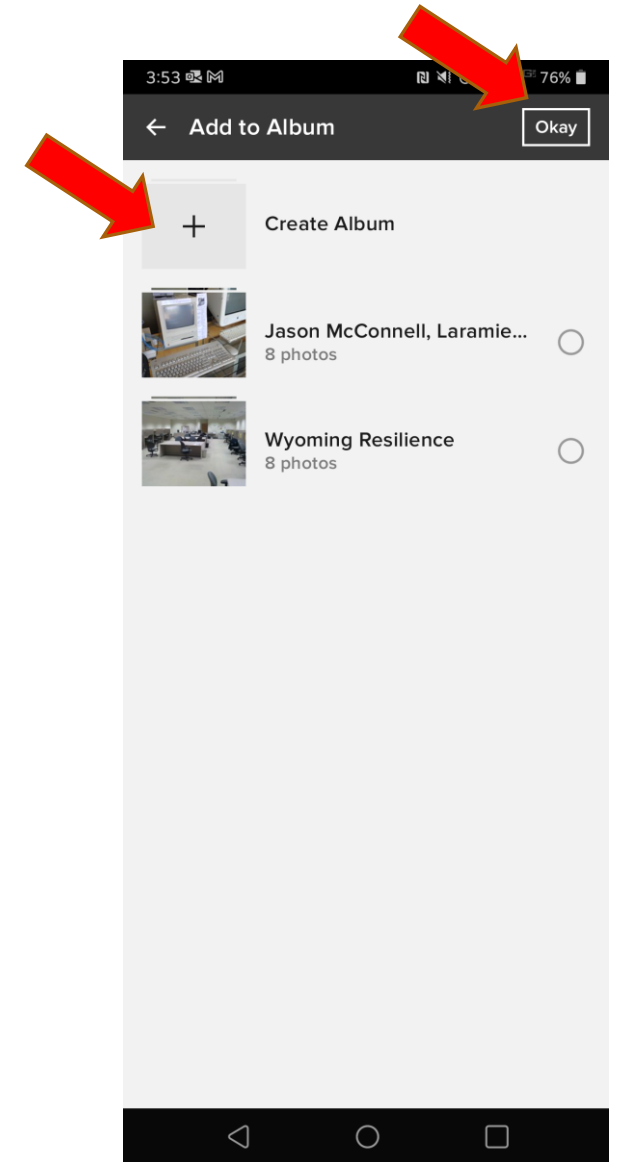
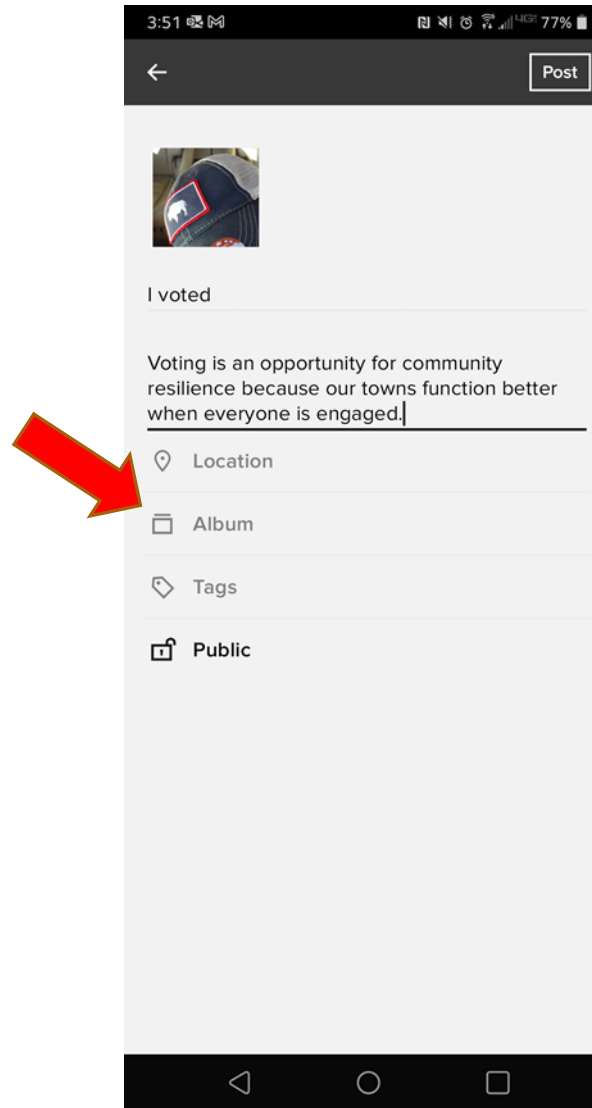
Adding Photos: Titles & Descriptions

20. This takes you to where you add a title of your choice.
21. You also add your description. Here, describe what this photo means to you (how this photo represents a barrier or opportunity to *educational achievement, employment opportunities* or *community resilience* in your community.) You can add the location of the photo if you would like.



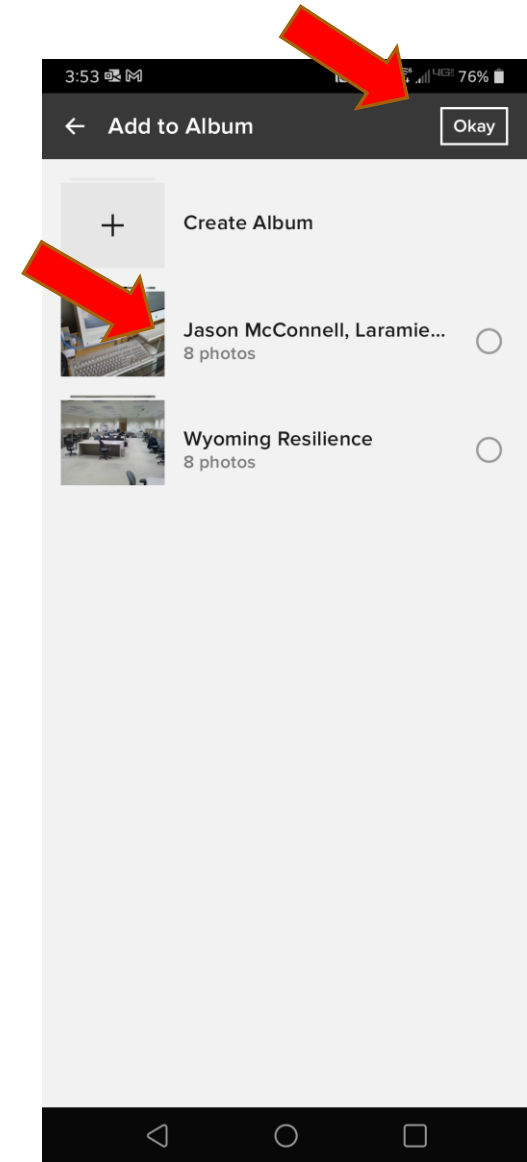
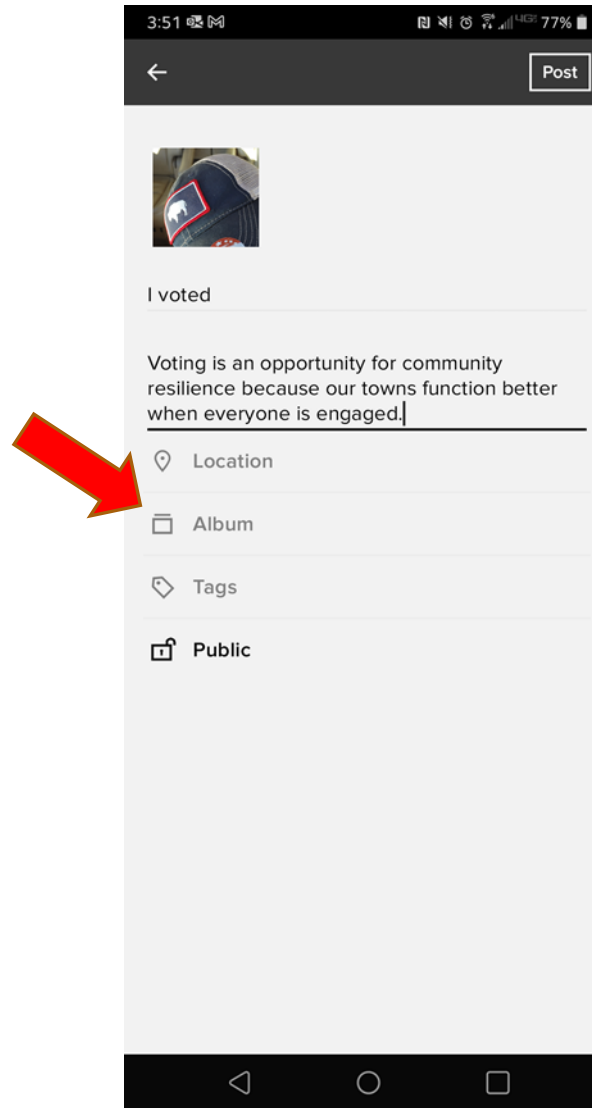
Adding Photos: Albums

22. After completing your description, click the “Album” option.
23. On the “Add to Album” screen, click “Create Album” to create a new album for our project.
24. Name the album your full name and town of residence. Then click “Save” to save your new album and “Okay” to proceed.



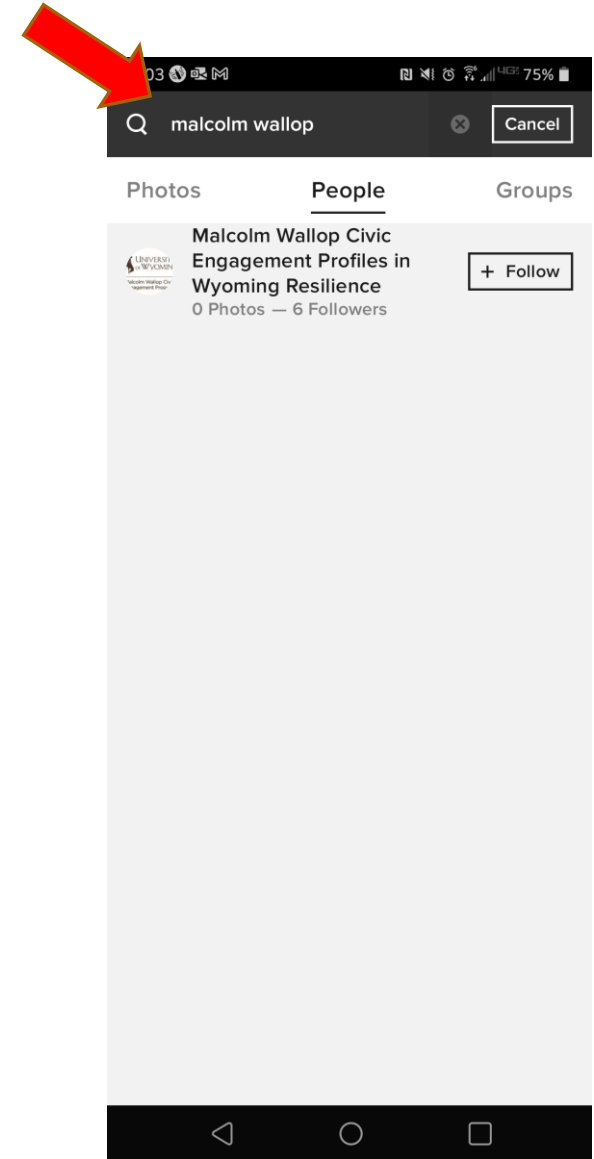
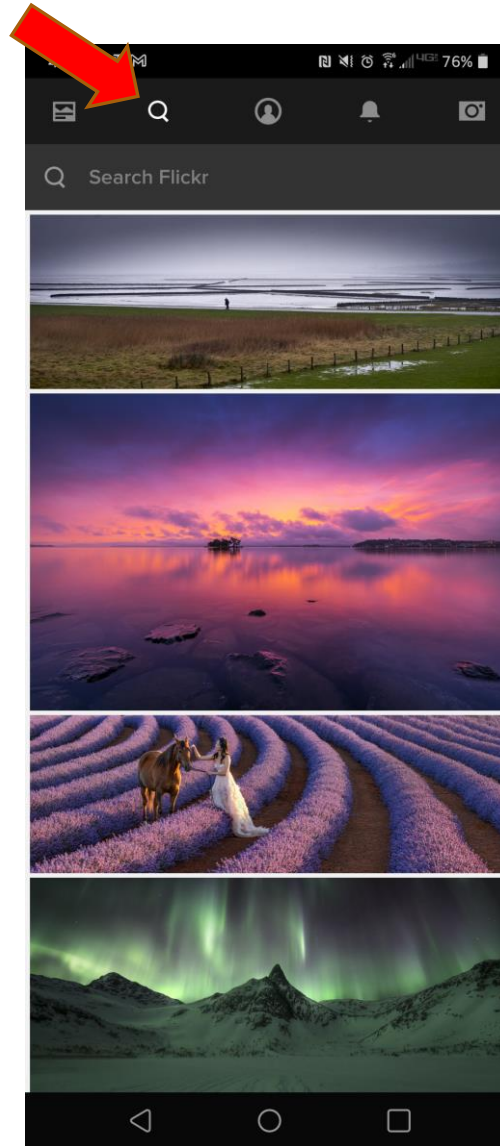
Adding More Photos

25. To add the rest of your photos that you are contributing to the project, repeat steps 13-22.
26. However, on Step 23, you do not need to create a new album for every photo. After writing your description, scroll down and click on “Album”, and your album “Full Name-Town of Residence” should be already an option.
27. Click on it and hit “Okay” on the top right corner.



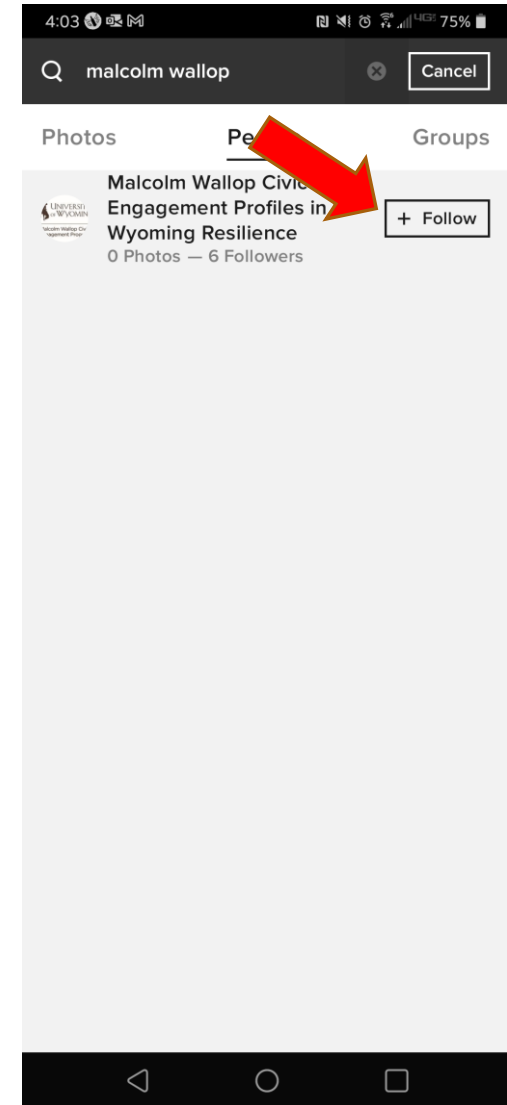
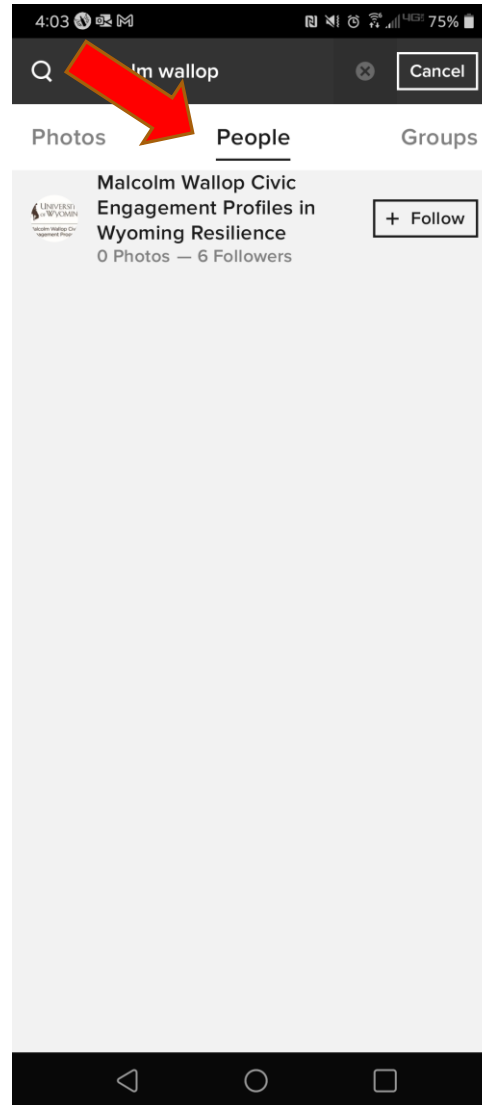
Sharing Albums

28. Share this album of photos with us. To do so, on the Flickr App home screen, click the “Magnifying Glass” icon, second from the left corner on the menu bar at the top.
29. Type in “Malcolm Wallop Civic Engagement Profiles in Wyoming Resilience”.



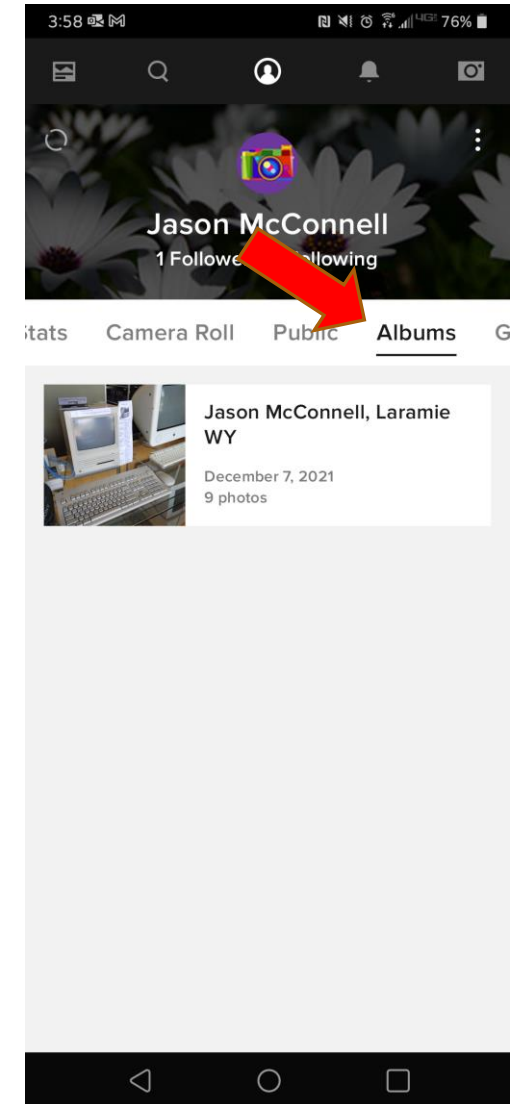
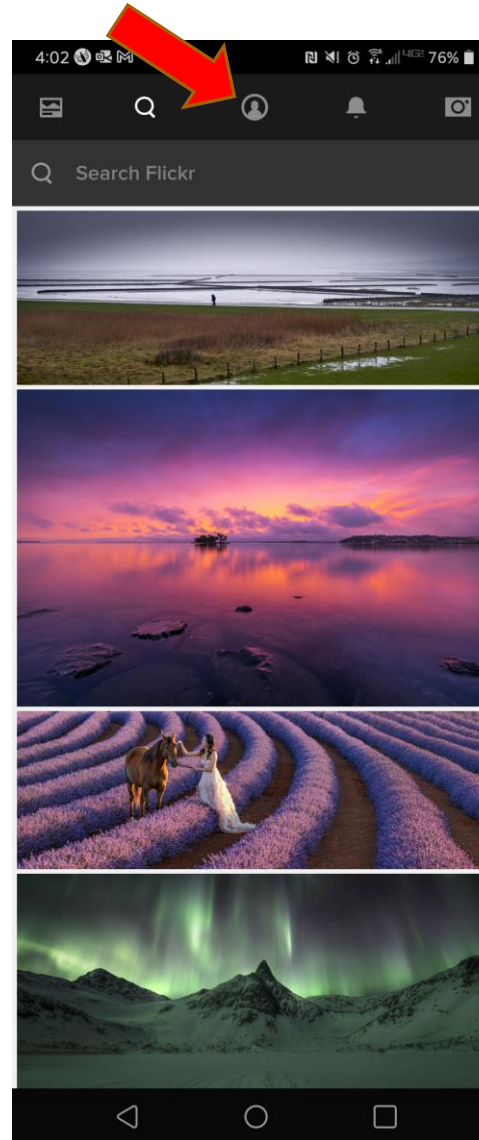
Sharing Albums

30. Under the search bar at the top, you will see “Photos”, “People” and “Groups”. Click on “People” and our project should be at the very top.
31. Click the “Follow” Icon next to the project name. It’ll show a checkmark next to our name once you’ve followed us.



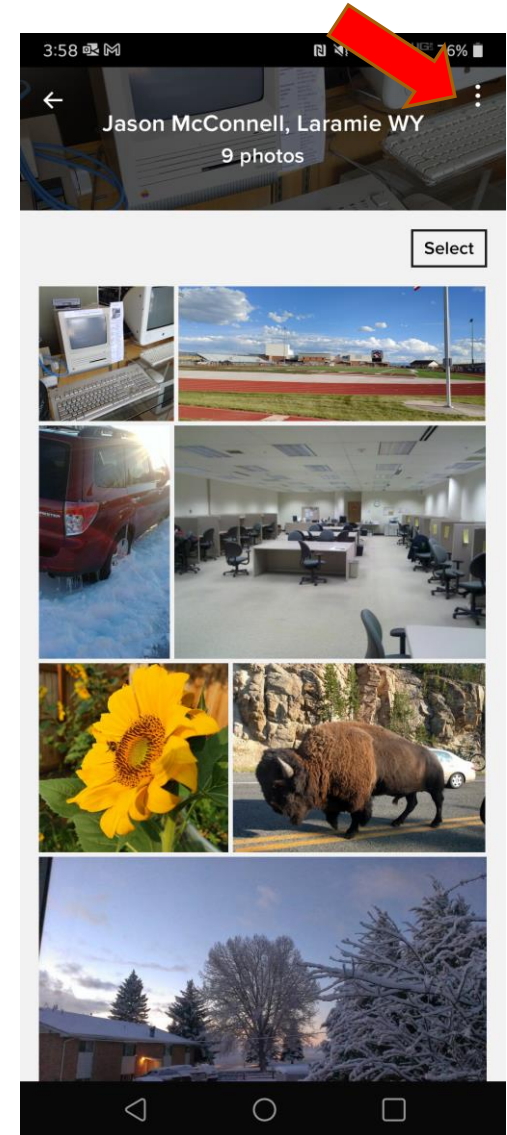
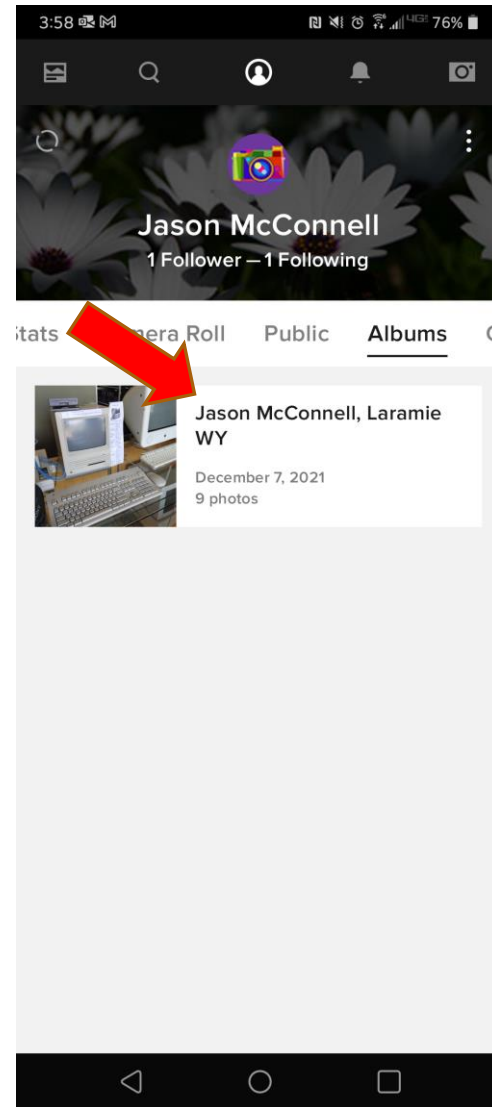
Sharing Albums

32. Hit the “Back” arrow, in the top left hand corner of your screen to return to the Flickr app home page.
33. Now press the “Person” icon in the top menu bar to return to your profile.
34. Once there, click “Albums” to reveal your list of Flickr albums.



Sharing Albums

- 35. Click on the album you created for the project (Full Name – Town of Residence)
- 36. Click on the “menu button” with the three dots icon in the top right corner of the page.



Sharing Albums

37. On the drop-down menu that pops up, click “Share”. Click “Share All Items”
38. Choose your preferred email app from the list below.
39. Once your email app opens, type in wallop@uwyo.edu as the email recipient and send!
