



2019 NEH Summer Stipend Competition

Each year WIHR, on behalf of UW, nominates up to two candidates (one junior/pre-tenure and one senior/post-tenure) for the NEH Summer Stipend award. The NEH stipend provides \$6,000 for full-time work on a humanities project for a period of two consecutive months in summer 2019. Information about the award appears on the NEH website:

In recognition of the fact that this is a highly competitive program, WIHR provides support should the UW candidate(s) not be selected by the NEH. The two nominees will each receive reimbursements up to \$3,000 for the period ending in June of 2019. A further \$3,000 may be awarded to each candidate, depending on the availability of new funds, at the beginning of the next fiscal year (July 1, 2019).

Deadlines

ASAP:

- Candidates should visit <https://www.neh.gov/grants/research/summer-stipends> to download Summer Stipend guidelines and the application package.
- Candidates should register with Grants.gov, and also download the Adobe Reader. Taking these steps early in your process will expedite final submission to the NEH if you are the chosen candidate for this competition, or apply to another NEH competition.
- Candidates may also wish to consult previous UW competitors (e.g., Michelle Jarman, Michael Edson, Scott Henkel, Caroline McCracken-Flesher, Conxita Domenesh).

Friday September 7, by 9 a.m.:

- Completed application must be submitted to WIHR.
 - Compile the application as one document.
 - References are not due at this time, but the application should name those who have agreed to serve as references on an additional sheet, indicating their role and institution.
 - Submit application to WIHR via email.
 - Enter email header as “NEH Summer Stipend Application.”

Friday September 21:

- Candidates will be notified of results by WIHR peer review panel.

BY Friday September 28:

- UW’s 2 candidate(s) must personally submit their revised application to the NEH via grants.gov.
