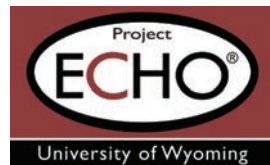

About the Medicaid Waiver Services Network

UW ECHO in Waiver Services is a network of state-wide professionals providing services to Medicaid Waiver participants. This network provides a community for professional development and the sharing of best practices.

Who should attend:

Network participants could include waiver service providers, prescribers, case managers, participant support specialists, and individuals working with participants in Community Choices, Children's Mental Health, Adult Acquired Brain Injury, Comprehensive and Supports waivers.

What is UW ECHO?

UW ECHO (Extension for Community Healthcare Outcomes) delivers virtual professional development to support community conversations around best practice in education, health, and disability services.

- Participate in training and co-management of individual, agency, and state concerns to improve waiver participant outcomes
