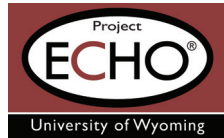

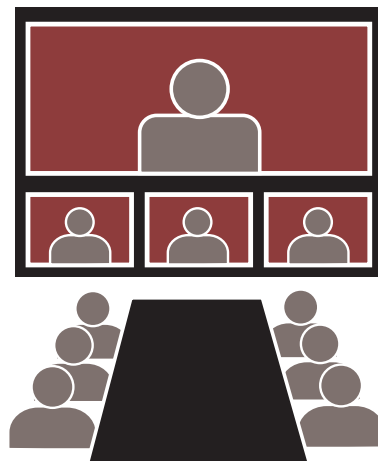

### WHO SHOULD ATTEND:



## BEHAVIORAL HEALTH NETWORK
