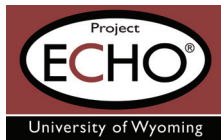

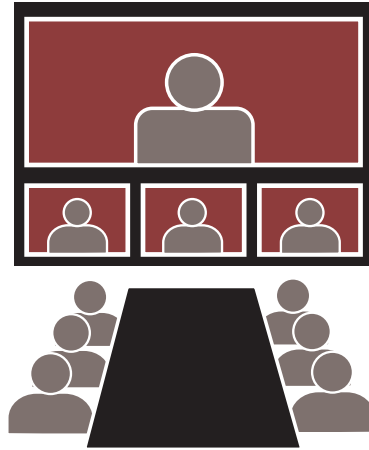

WHAT IS UW ECHO?

UW ECHO (Extension for Community Healthcare Outcomes) offers virtual professional development to support community conversations around best practice in education, health, and disability services.

The **Student Health** network provides ongoing support for school nurses and other professionals working to enhance the physical, mental, and emotional well-being of K-12 school-aged students.



WHO SHOULD ATTEND:

Network participants include school nurses, school administrators, school counselors, health and physical education teachers, school psychologists, primary care providers, primary care staff, healthcare administrators, and state agency staff.
