AAC Assessment Process participants will:**

- Develop working definitions of AAC terminology
- Learn about several AAC assessment framework models
- Be introduced to a variety of AAC assessment tools
- Learn about the importance of feature matching & device trials
- Learn about the key components required in the AAC/ Speech Generating Device (SGD) report for funding

Location: Online distance learning course via WyoLearn, the UW learning management platform. Assignments may be completed at any time during each week, but will require on average 2 hours of participation weekly. Participants will be required to attend one virtual class meeting using ZOOM, a video conferencing platform, during week 6, as part of a required assignment.
