Population: Goshen County (13,342) Torrington (6,624)




- In July 2021: % fully vaccinated
- Goshen county: 27.2%
- Wyoming: 30.7%
- United States: 45%

- Promotional materials by Public Health
- False information in the community causing vaccine-hesitancy

Literature Review:

- Comparing health care workers (HCWs) response to influenza vaccination rates in 2016 (Corace, K. M., et. All)
- Several common predictors of vaccine acceptance amongst HCWs were found
- The Health Belief Model and Theory of Planned Behavior
 - 5 key constructs are reliable predictors of vaccination acceptance amongst HCWs
- These models/theories were used to create educational materials to administer and promote vaccine acceptance

Community Health Project Plan:

- Collect research-based information on the COVID-19 pandemic and vaccine from various sources
- Create a power point presentation (PPP) and fact sheet
- 5 key constructs
- Educate HCWs on how to utilize the materials for continued education

Deliverables:

- PPP targeted to HCWs made to be presented by other HCWs
- COVID-19 fact sheet targeted to the general public

Next Step:

- Public Health nurses and/or Banner Health Clinic providers present the PPP to HCWs in the community
- HCWs distribute fact sheet to general public and patients
