

Invertebrates with Endangered Species Act status in Wyoming

Listed Threatened

Western Glacier Stonefly (*Zapada glacier*)

Who: Insect, Stonefly (Plecoptera), Spring Stoneflies (Nemouridae)

ESA action: Petitioned for ESA listing in 2010

Received a substantial 90-day find in 2011

Received a substantial 12 month finding in 2016

Listed Threatened in 2019

Species Biological Report in 2020

Draft Recovery Plan in 2021 (target Final in 2022)

Where: Alpine streams of Glacier National Park and the Teton Range

What is WYNDD doing: Annual surveys since 2015, increased the number of sites known (Thanks to UW-NPS!)

Coming up: Currently identifying *Zapada glacier* in other mountains of Wyoming. Results expected spring 2022. Funding from the R2 Forest Service.



Warranted but precluded

Monarch (*Danaus plexippus*)

Who: Insect, Butterfly (Lepidoptera), Fritillary (Nymphalidae)

ESA action: Petitioned for ESA listing in 2013

Received a substantial 90-day find in 2015

Warranted but precluded decision in December 2020

Annually reviewed, planned ESA listing in 2024

Where: Most of continental United States, migrates from southern Mexico to southern Canada and back annually

What is WYNDD doing: Observed 11 Monarchs in eastern Wyoming during 2021 (Thanks to Wyoming Governor's Office!)

Coming up: 2022 surveys in eastern Wyoming



Petitioned for listing

Narrow-foot Hygrotus Diving Beetle (*Hygrotus diversipes*)

Who: Insect, Beetle (Coleoptera), predacious diving beetle (Dytiscidae)

ESA action: Category 2 Candidate Species from 1989 to 1996

Petitioned for ESA listing in 2007, 2008 and 2013

Received a substantial 90-day find in 2016

Species Status Assessment expected summer 2022

Listing decision in 2023

Where: Found only in intermittent streams of central Wyoming

What is WYNDD doing: Annual surveys of known sites since 2010 and 3 statewide surveys (Thanks to BLM & Wyoming Governor's Office!)

Coming up: Intensive work at known sites

Suckley Cuckoo Bumble Bee (*Bombus suckleyi*)

Who: Insect, Bee (Hymenoptera), bumble bee (Apidae)

ESA action: Petitioned for ESA listing in 2020

Received a substantial 90-day find in 2021

Under review, but not part of current 5-year listing workplan

Where: Western United States, throughout Wyoming

What is WYNDD doing: Statewide survey for Wyoming (Thanks to BLM!)

Coming up: Searching for funding to continue bumble bee surveys

Who: Insect, Bee (Hymenoptera), bumble bee (Apidae)

ESA action: Petitioned for ESA listing in 2015

Received a substantial 90-day find in 2016

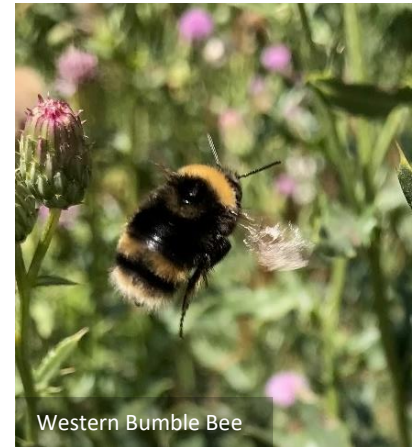
Species Status Assessment expected summer 2022

Listing decision in 2023

Where: Western United States, throughout Wyoming

What is WYNDD doing: Statewide survey and predictive distribution model for Wyoming, resampled historic sites (Thanks to BLM!)

Coming up: Searching for funding to continue bumble bee surveys



American Bumble Bee (*Bombus pensylvanicus*)

Who: Insect, Bee (Hymenoptera), bumble bee (Apidae)

ESA action: Petitioned for ESA listing in 2021

Received a substantial 90-day find in 2021

Under review, but not part of current 5-year listing workplan

Where: Eastern United States, eastern Wyoming

What is WYNDD doing: Statewide survey in Wyoming (Thanks to BLM!)

Coming up: Searching for funding to continue bumble bee surveys



Regal Fritillary (*Argynnis idalia*)

Who: Insect, Butterfly (Lepidoptera), Fritillary (Nymphalidae)

ESA action: Petitioned for ESA listing in 2013

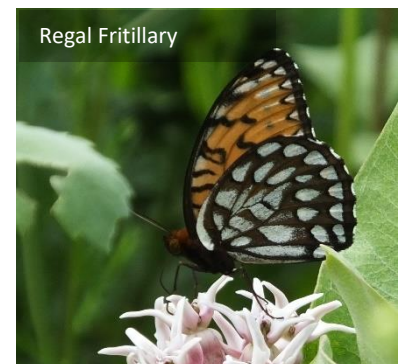
Received a substantial 90-day find in 2015

Species Status Assessment and Listing decision in 2022

Where: From eastern Wyoming to east coast, disappeared from eastern portion of range

What is WYNDD doing: Surveys in summer 2021, 5 individuals observed from 5 sites (Thanks to Wyoming Governor's Office!)

Coming up: 2022 Surveys in eastern Wyoming



Invertebrates with Endangered Species Act status in Wyoming

Great Basin Silverspot (*Speyeria nokomis nokomis*)

Who: Insect, Butterfly (Lepidoptera), Fritillary (Nymphalidae)

ESA action: Petitioned for ESA listing in 2013

Received a substantial 90-day find in 2016

Listing decision expected spring 2022

Where: Southwestern United States (no records in Wyoming, but observations along boarder in Colorado and Utah)

What is WYNDD doing: Surveys in 2019, none observed

Coming up: Searching for funding for more surveys
