PROPOSAL DEADLINE: **Friday, 10/5/2018**

I. GENERAL

The main goal of the Wyoming INBRE External Scientific Advisor Program (ESAP) is to provide biomedical researchers at UW with meaningful in-depth input in their research by an established expert in their field. INBRE would provide resources for on-campus visits including costs for travel, accommodations, and an honorarium. Proposals can be initiated by individuals or groups of faculty seeking guidance into ongoing areas of research or anticipated new lines of investigation. It would be expected that visiting scientific advisors would spend several days on campus meeting with relevant individuals and/or research groups and would give a public seminar. Although this opportunity is not generally intended for bringing in peer-level or long-term collaborators, INBRE will consider such requests if there is sufficient scientific merit.

II. DEADLINES

The deadline for receipt of invited full proposals is **5:00 PM Friday, 10/5/2018**. Please e-mail your application as a single pdf (text recognition format) to Dr. Scott Seville (sseville@uwyo.edu) INBRE Program Director, and to Dr. David S. Fay (davidfay@uwyo.edu), DRPP Director. **Late applications will not be considered.**

III. ELIGIBILITY OF PROJECT INVESTIGATOR

All University of Wyoming tenure-track faculty with biomedical research programs are eligible to apply. We particularly encourage junior investigators seeking mentor-type relationships with well-established senior researchers in their fields.

IV. PREPARATION AND FORMAT OF PROPOSALS

Proposals should include a single-page description of the qualifications of the scientific advisor along with their relevance to individuals or groups of faculty at UW and a budget not to exceed \$3,000. In the description include how the on-campus visit by the scientific advisor would likely enhance the success of ongoing or future applicant research programs. In addition, CVs from the individual or groups submitting the proposal should be included as well as the CV of the scientific advisor. These should be submitted as a single PDF document.
