Greg holds two degrees from the University of Wyoming in Accounting, 1977, and Law, 1980. He was named Person of the Year by the Greater Cheyenne Chamber of Commerce in 2008 and was awarded the Community Spirit Award by the Wyoming Tribune Eagle in 2014. He was recognized as an Outstanding Eagle Scout by the National Eagle Scout Association in 2017. He was an inaugural inductee to the Wyoming Debate Hall of Fame in 2009.
