UARC Meeting Minutes 3 October 2006

Call to Order:

The October meeting was called to order by President Jim KD7KMU at 7:33 pm in room 2 of the Wyoming Union. 13 members were in attendance; all officers were present. Secretary's Report:

There was a motion by Bill AF7E that the minutes of the September meeting be approved as published in the Code of the West, Wayne NQ7Q seconded the motion which was unanimously approved.

Treasurer's Report:

The meeting refreshment committee asked for a volunteer for the next meeting. Jim KD7KMU volunteered.

Old Business:

Discussion of the 440 repeater purchase was postponed until Jerry N7JT and Doug KD7W are present.

Suzanne AA7AY reported that the deposit fee to the Forest Service for High Plains Roundup was refunded and will be returned to the High Plains account.

Jim KD7KMU reported that the RSO paperwork had been completed and submitted. He thanked Bill AF7E, John KD7NAE, Doris KD7RQX, Bob Kubichek N7CII, Foncey N0FT and KD7KMU for assisting with RSO day.

New Business:

KD7KMU reported that Steve Coulthard WL7CMA has offered to donate a trailer with 23 foot tower, 6 batteries, a solar charging panel and 5500 watt generator to the club. AF7E asked where it would be stored. Sheriff Pond has offered to store it at the county. The rig does not have a repeater. There was discussion about providing a repeater for the trailer and how to handle the other responsibilities that would be required.

There was discussion of mounting a 440 repeater at the Union tower site. At least half of the club members have dual band handheld or other mobile 440 availability. It would be nice to run such a repeater from the tower and move it as needed. The trailer is open. It was suggested that it would be possible to improve power at the tower with a solar unit and additional batteries. Fred KS7Q suggested that discussions with the county be postponed until after the county elections. Jim KD7KMU said that the trailer is available for the club to see at Steve WL7CMA's shop. It was noted that such a rig would need constant checks of batteries, tires and other maintenance items to ensure readiness and that it would need to be stored outside to charge the batteries using the solar panels.

Jim KD7KNU appointed Bill AF7E and Wayne NQ7Q to a special events committee.

Wayne NQ7Q said that he had been contacted by Brent Gurnsey KC0FUP who is trying to revitalize the Casper club. Brent KC0FUP had requested assistance for tax exempt status. Fred KS7Q, Mac WB7K and Bill N7SXC were involved in the initial filing for our club. Fred KS7Q pointed out that it was very important to properly answer all questions. KD7NAE suggested that the Casper club get advice from an attorney as our club tried unsuccessfully for years. KD7KMU will look for our club's initial filing papers in the club archives.

KD7KMU announced that a student had contacted Doug KD7W regarding using our club for a semesterlong project. The club agreed that it was OK to proceed with the project. Jim KD7KMU is awaiting contact from the student.

Announcements:

There will be an ARES/RACES meeting in Jerry N7JT's lab 130 Physical Sciences building on Tuesday October 10th at 7:00 pm.

Fred KS7Q asked if the club's repeater was being maintained. Wayne NQ7Q and Jerry N7JT are taking care of the club's equipment.

Drawing:

A one year subscription to World Radio was awarded.

Meeting Adjourned:

Bill AF7E moved and Doug KD7W seconded that the meeting be adjourned at 8:05 pm.
