Successful completion of the 2+2 plan requires that a student remain continuously enrolled and graduate with the associate's degree from his or her respective community college. • This is a guide for course work in the major; actual course sequence may vary by student. Please refer to the online student degree evaluation. • Not all courses are offered every semester and some electives may have prerequisites. Students should review the course descriptions in the catalogs of their respective institutions and consult with their academic advisor to plan accordingly. • Academic plans and course schedules may need to be altered if ACT or Math Placement scores require a student to take pre-college courses (e.g., MATH 0900, 0921, or 0925) before taking required math or English courses.

Laramie County Community College requirements:

In order to graduate, students must successfully complete a minimum of 60 credit hours, 15 of which must be from Laramie County Community College, with a grade point average of 2.0 or better at course level of 1000 or higher (ENGL 1001 does not apply).

University of Wyoming requirements:

Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 to graduate. • Students must complete 42 hours of upper division (3000-level or above) coursework, 30 of which must be from the University of Wyoming. • Courses must be taken for a letter grade unless offered only for S/U.

UW College of Arts and Sciences requirements:

Students must take two "core" courses in addition to UW's University Studies Program requirements: Diversity in the United States (ASD) and Global Awareness (ASG). • No more than 60 hours in the major subject may be used toward the 120 credit hours required for graduation. • At least 30 hours in the major subject must be completed with a grade of C or better (the major may require more).

a) Diversity Course. Select one (1) course from the following: AMST 2100 (Introduction to American Studies), ANTH 2210 (North American Indians), ENGL 2340 (Native American Culture and Literature), HIST 2290 (History of North American Indians), HIST/WMST 2389 (History of Women and the American West), or HUMN/SOC 1080 (Introduction to Women's Studies).

b) Elective Courses. Choose three (3) courses from the following: ART 1000 (General Art), HUMN 1020 (Introductory Humanities II), HIST 2390/HUMN 2395 (Mexican Civilization), PHIL 1000, (Introduction to Philosophy), SPAN 1071 (Intensive Spanish Abroad Conversation - spring only), SPAN 2070 (Intensive Spanish Abroad - spring only), or SPAN 2140 (Introduction to Spanish Literature in Spanish - spring only).

c) Global Course. Choose one (1) course from the following: ANTH 1200 (Introduction to Cultural Anthropology), ANTH 1300 (Introduction to Archaeology), BUSN 2000 (International Business), ECON 1000 (Global Economic Issues), GEOG 1020 (Human Geography), HIST 2320 (History of Islam), PHIL 2311 (Introduction to Religion), and SPAN 2140 (Introduction to Spanish Literature in Spanish). • SPAN 2140 strongly recommended *.

UW Spanish Program Notes:

A study abroad experience is highly recommended and students should consider taking SPAN 2070 (Intensive Spanish Abroad - spring semester) at LCCC or SPAN 3070 (Intensive Spanish Abroad - summer semester) at UW. Consult with an academic advisor about which programs and courses to take to prepare.

* Students majoring in Spanish: Language-Linguistics must take 31 semester hours of Spanish course work beyond SPAN 2030, which is taken in the third semester of the program at LCCC. This includes the courses listed in the plan plus an additional 15 hours of electives above SPAN 2030.

** Spanish: Language-Linguistics majors are strongly encouraged to take the following two (2) electives:

- SPAN 3080 Spanish in the USA
- SPAN 4080 Fourth Year Spanish II

^ Strongly recommend taking SPAN 4200 (Introduction to Research).

*** To fulfill an upper division elective, Spanish: Language-Linguistic track majors may take one (1) class from the following five (5) courses offered by other departments: ANTH 4775 (Language and Gender), ANTH 4785 (Language and Racism), ANTH 4795 (Language Change), LANG 4785 (Linguistics, Language Teaching and Social Context), and SPPA 3160 (Language Development).
