### B.S. Agricultural Business, Agribusiness Management Program Notes:

This curriculum is for students preparing for careers in the agribusiness field. Applied agricultural economics courses are supplemented with marketing, management, finance and other courses from the College of Business and production-oriented courses from other departments in the College of Agriculture and Natural Resources.

- The major requires students to earn nine (9) hours of upper division credit from the College of Business, excluding MKT 3210 when taken in lieu of AGEC 4050. Agricultural business majors cannot take more than 30 credits from the College of Business, excluding USP designated courses, unless they declare a second major in the College of Business.
- The major requires students to earn eighteen (18) hours of upper division credit in Agricultural Economics (AGEC), not including the courses necessary to fulfill the C2 and C3 requirements.
- **AG Econ:** Twenty four (24) credits in Ag Econ beyond those earned to satisfy the USP requirements. Eighteen (18) of these 24 credit hours must be at the 3000-4000 level.

- Students may not take a course for S/U credit to satisfy any requirement, unless the course is offered for S/U credit only.

### University of Wyoming Requirements

- Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 to graduate.
- Students must complete 42 hours of upper division (3000-level or above) coursework, 30 of which must be from the University of Wyoming.
- Courses must be taken for a single letter grade unless offered only for S/U.
- University Studies Program (USP), Human Culture (H) and Physical & Natural World (PN) courses must be taken outside of the major subject, but can be cross-listed with the major.

### **College of Agriculture and Natural Resources**

The Department of Agriculture and Applied Economics does not allow AG Economics (AGEC) or Economics (ECON) courses to fulfill the USP Human Culture (H) requirement. If pursuing a minor in the College of Business, a grade of C or better must be earned in coursework applying to the minor as well as an overall GPA of 2.5 or better.

- At least 30 hours in the major subject must be completed with a grade of C or better (individual majors may require more).

The University of Wyoming Office of the Registrar provides final approval of degree completion requirements prior to the awarding of any degree.
