## University of Wyoming, 2015-16

At the University of Wyoming, it is impossible to earn an "undeclared" degree. The "undeclared" classification is temporary in nature and is designed to allow students to consider and explore different majors and career paths. For maximum success and efficiency, students are advised to declare and concentrate on a major discipline as soon as possible. Therefore, this plan establishes a pathway for only one year. Students hoping to pursue a career in elementary or secondary education should decide on their teaching content area no later than the first semester of their sophomore year. This is a guide for course work in the major; actual course sequence may vary by student. Please refer to the online student degree evaluation, and consult with an academic advisor. • Not all courses are offered every semester and some electives may have prerequisites. Students should review the course descriptions in the *University Catalog* and consult with their academic advisor to plan accordingly.

### University of Wyoming requirements:

Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 to graduate. • Students must complete 42 hours of upper division (3000-level or above) coursework, 30 of which must be from the University of Wyoming. • Courses must be taken for a letter grade unless offered only for S/U. • University Studies Program (USP) Human Culture (H) and Physical & Natural World (PN) courses must be taken outside of the major subject, but can be cross listed with the major.

### College of Education requirements:

The college assumes student college readiness. Student should be able to start taking 1000 level courses the first semester of college.

• All major content courses must be completed with a grade of C or higher. Grades of C- or lower will not satisfy this requirement.

• The Wyoming Teacher Education Program operates in a series of phases: Phase I, Phase II, Phase IIIa, and Phase IIIb.

Continuation in the program in any content area is dependent upon the successful completion of prerequisites for each phase. In order to continue on to Phase I (after the freshman year), the following conditions must be met:

- Completed admission to the College of Education and an approved background check on file with the Office of Teacher Education.
- A minimum UW gpa of 2.50.
- Sophomore standing (30+ credits)
- Successful completion of EDST 2450 (Foundations of Development & Learning) and ITEC 2360 (Teaching with Technology).

\* All math and many science courses have a minimum ACT and/or Math Placement Exam score requirement that must be met before enrollment in the course is allowed. \*\* The prerequisite of a 2.50 cumulative UW gpa is waived for new, incoming freshman having declared Education as their major.
