#### **UNDERLYING PREMISES:**

WICHE's Professional Student Exchange Program enables students to enroll in selected out-of-state professional programs because fields of study are not available at public institutions in their home states. The number of students supported by a state is determined through state legislative appropriations.

Based on projected slots for students and costs in FY13, the average cost per year per student in Wyoming is \$20,392 (\$40,784/biennium).

The savings are achieved by not admitting students in fall 2012 and carrying over per student cost savings in fall 2013.

WICHE funds will be used to support Doctor of Osteopathy (D.O.) degree students. M.D. degree students are supported via WWAMI.
