UNION PACIFIC RAILWAY (RAILROAD) COMPANY Collection

Following is a random listing (no organization) of the contents of File #1 in general manuscript files for (R13-u) "RAILROADS-UNION PACIFIC file 1". This lists materials as of this date, April 19, 1973, and a copy of this listing should become a part of the permanent collection receipt for Acc. No. 311. The disorder of these several files indicates that at some future date, a reorganization and receipting of these materials should be undertaken. (Chuck Roundy/April 19, 1973)

Document: Ltr. fr Secy of Interior transmitting "In answer to Senate Resolu. of March 20, 1885, copies of contracts of UPRR Co. with Western Union Telegraph Co. (79 pages)
Document: "Union Pacific Railway Company," Ltr. fr. Atty Genl pursuant to House Resolution dtd Oct. 14, 1893, a draft of a bill to reorg. UPRRCo and to readjust and secure claims of US against said company.

Photographic print copies of mss.: (Possibly should be in photo files?) 5 labeled as "U.P. --Docs -- Letter, Financial Data, UP Acc. 311, Folder 7," including James Fisk Jr. UPRRCo stock certificate as one, and 4 other financial data mss. in prints; and 3 other photo prints of mss. labeled "U.P. --Docs--Letters, Work Reports, Folder b, Acc. (UP) No. 311."

Souvenir Booklet: "The Trans-Missippi and International Exposition, Omaha, Nebraska, cyrt/ in 1898 by E.L. Lomax, Genl Pass and Ticket Agent, UPRRC, Omaha.

UP RR Time Tables, April 24, 1966.

Booklet: UNION PACIFIC RAILROAD: A BRIEF HISTORY, 11th printing, May, 1952.

Map: "Military Map of the United States," printed by UPRRCo, fr. Harry Stewart Coll, Acc. No. 644.

Booklet (Blue) : ~~Poplar~~ "New Album of Resorts On The Union Pacific," no date, but stamped inside back cover "Barkalow Bros, Rail Road News Agents, Omaha, Neb." (c. 1900)

Clippings: fr. Union Pacific Magazine for the 1920s, some 15 separate historical articles.

Folder #2 "(R13-u) RAILROADS-UNION PACIFIC File 2" in WHRC general manuscript files, items listed as of April 19, 1973, in no special organization. Reorganization and re-inventory is indicated at some future date.

Booklet: "History of the Union Pacific Railroad" issued by UP at May 10, 1919 (50th) celebration at Ogden, Utah (listed as Acc. No. 8 -Grace Raymond Hebard donation

Booklet: "Sights and Scenes From the Car Windows of the Union Pacific The Overland Route" (Council Bluffs & Kansas City to SFO) 127 numbered pages, 1910 cyrt.

Booklet: "Along The Union Pacific System" 86 pages, not dated.

Report: "Report to the Stockholders of the Union Pacific Railroad for the year 1873," Boston: Printed for the Company, 1874." (Note: An especially valuable item considering the events of 1873 in the financial world, particularly as involving Western railroads.)

Booklet: "Union Pacific Outings - Hunting In Colorado and Wyoming," 31 pages, cy 1913 by UPRCo.

List: "List of Pictures in the Union Pacific Collection," Acc. No. 311. (Note: these pictures appear to have been scattered throughout the Manuscript Files and in the photo files according to sub-topic. No attempted seems to have been made to keep them together or to keep track of separate locations of 253 photos listed. Most are in pertinent photo or manuscript files, however. Best of luck! Some are in this file # 2 as will be noted.)

File No 2 (R13-u) listing continued

Photographic prints: Of rare manuscript items pertaining to UPRR history, these should actually all be listed individually with locaters noted on the list----

44 such prints are in File Folder No. 2 of UPRR mss. file, including prints of very rare poster and letters from the late 1860s. Some, but not all of these include: W.A. Carter cattle shipping ad(fr. Fort Bridger, WY July 2, 1867); Casement to Durant, N. v. 1, 1866; Durant to Casement, Feby 8, 1866; Credit Mobilier Stock Certificat of UP owned shares, poster-~~Smoky Hill~~/Smoky Hill Route of UP, April 67; poster-The Black Hills and Sidney Stage Line; poster- May 10, 1869, Grand Opening Platte Valley Route to SFO; poster-UP Railway through Kansas & Nebraska to Rockies and Beyond; Maps, several, Abraham Lincoln ltr. designating Omaha as the eastern terminus of UP, Nov. 17, 1863; Telegram from G.M. Dodge on completion of road to Promontory Summit; Brigham Young to Joseph A. Young, undated; Agreement covering sale of wood by H.D.Cox to Henry Rolfer, wood to be delivered to UP; Early rare time schedules dating from 1866 ~~12/11/1866~~ 5 separeate; poster-Union Pacific, Omaha to North Platte open, "The Shortest and Quickest Route Between the Mountains And the East is Via the Union Pacific R.R. Now Open from Omaha to North Platte," 300 miles west of the Missouri River, March 8th, 1867.; UP Lands offered in Nebraska (poster); and poster - "The Union Pacific Railway through Kansas and Nebraska to the Rockies and Beyond,"; and other mss. items on photo print paper. ---As noted above, there are 44 of these prints in the Folder 2 of R13-u, and some close listing and organization does seem indicated here.

Booklet(Brochures) 3 similar "Along the Union Pacific System," c. 1920s, UP printed.

As with the other listed materials, there is no logical sequence to these files, no reason for material to be in any particular folder other than "it is there." Hence this listing is a random listing of materials in File Folder # 4 on April 19, 1973.

Article: R.S. Cotterill, "Early Agitation For A Pacific Railroad, 1845-1850," in ATHENAEUM, (not known) - item is marked "Hebard" indicating from Hebard Files.

Booklet: "History of the Union Pacific Railroad," Issued By the Union Pacific Railroad on the occasion of the Celebration at Ogen, Utah, May 10, 1919 on 50th Anniversary of driving of the Golden Spike." (Second copy listed, an earlier copy in File # 1 or 2)?

Newspaper Article: Lengthy full 2 page article "The Pacific Railroad-Open," from an unknown paper (or possibly simply a two page printed piece, not taken from any paper), stamped as part of the UW Archives's "Thomas C. Durant Collection, Acc. No. 598." (A Very interesting propaganda piece, c. 1869 or 1870)

Manuscript: "Building The Union Pacific Railway on the Boundary Line Between Nebraska and Wyoming," by G.R. Hebard, May 1929 with Bret Harte poem attached. (9 p mss & 3 p. poem)

Manuscript: Copy from THE ROMANCE OF THE RAILS by Agnes C. Laut, 9 pages

Manuscript: Untitled-rs: W.M. Jeffers statement of October 1938, UPRR, probably a press release (20 mimeographed pages)

Article: fr. Sat. Evening Post "TOWARD THE MILLENNIUM "The Railroad Builders," by F. Britten Austin

Brochure: UP published, "TODAY'S TRAIN TOMORROW"

Booklet: "Wyoming and the Union Pacific Celebrate Centennial, 1868-1968"

Correspondence: G.R. Hebard correspondence on UP construction research, 7 pages stapled together.

Bibliography: (G.R. Hebard) "The Union Pacific RR" listing sources on one page.

Correspondence: Photocopy of Nov. 3, 1864 ltr. to Abe Lincoln fr. T.C. Durant, stamped "Thomas C. Durant Collection, Acc. No. 593" on reverse side./Lincoln's reply attached (part of photostat) approved the map of the first 100 miles West of Omaha and is signed by Lincoln. (Valuable -historically- photo item)

Newsclipping: Newburyport Daily Herald, Newburyport, Mass, Dec. 4, 1846 with lead article "Great Pacific Railroad." (Interesting early agitation for transcontinental railroad)

Notice: Fr. UP Land Department, Omaha, April 21, 1891, from B.A. McAllaster, printed one page pertaining to collection of accounts on land and town lot contracts. (Marked Acc. # 20, WHRC)

Newsclippings: Miscellaneous clippings, including 2 in a small envelope from the "Durant Collection, Acc. No. 593."

Mss item: Fr. Thomas C. Durant Coll, Acc. No. 593, Notice of completion of contract agreement to Hudson River Railroad, 21 April 1854 (Misfiled here)

Mss. item: Fr. Clarence Dunder Coll., Acc. No. 141 : :tr/ frp, George Haywood to Gov Thos. Moonlight, Sept 9, 1887 on UPRailway stationary, Haywood applying for the vacant opening of Territorial Mining Inspector." (Probably should be refiled into biog. file, cross ref to "Mining-Wyoming-Territorial"

J.S. Casement Collection items-- Some 20 rather precious misc. mss. items from the J. . Casement Collection, Acc. # 308, which for one reason or another (????) were placed in this file folder for the UP rather than with the boxed collection. These contain a variety of items including quit claim land deeds, work receipts, etc. Also such items in Folder #4 have now been placed in a brown marked envelope. I would suggest (presumptuous!) that when the file folders are reorganized (When?) that these materials be placed in the boxed ~~J.S.~~ Casement Collection where the archives will have better control over these curiosity items./cgr
