## INVENTORY

THE CARL B. SQUIER COLLECTION, Acc. #5728-88-02-22

Carl Brown Squier (1893-1967), aviation pioneer and corporation executive, was the 13th licensed pilot in the United States in 1916. He enlisted during WWI in the Aviation Branch of the Signal Corps, served as combat pilot and flew with Eddie Rickenbacker. Squier had a distinguished service record and was awarded the French Cross of War. He was discharged with the rank of Captain in 1919.

He continued flying weekends (barnstorming), and prior to 1929 was employed by important companies such as Aerocraft, Glen L. Martin, Stinson, Eastman and Detroit Aircraft. In 1929 he was sent to take over Detroit Aircraft's subsidiary, Lockheed Aircraft Corporation, serving as general manager, and subsequently, vice-president in charge of sales. Working on commercial and military sales until his retirement in 1958, Squier became known as "The Best-known Airplane Salesman in the World".

Mr. Squier was a member of various aviation organizations including Quiet Birdmen, National Aeronautic Association, Aviators Post #350 of the American Legion, 90th Aero Association, Institute of Aerospace Sciences, Wings Club, Conquistadores del Cielo, OX5 Club of America and many others.

The material in this collection includes correspondence, biographical information, interviews (tapes and transcriptions), photographs, speeches, scrapbooks, and research files regarding Carl Squier, his friends and associates who were pioneers and management officials from aviation and aerospace industry. Included were Eddie Rickenbacker, James J. Doolittle, Wiley Post, Amelia Earhart, Roscoe Turner, the Charles Lindberghs and others such as Robert and Courtland Gross, Howard Hughes, Eddie Stinson, Glen Martin.

Other Carl Squier material is located at the Howard Museum, Burbank, California (donated by his widow, June Knight Squier Buehler in 1968) where they are a part of the Lockheed Aircraft Corporation History.
