Biography

Murray Teigh Bloom (b. 1916) is one of American's foremost free lance writers. He attended Columbia University and received an Master of Science degree from the Graduate School of Journalism in 1938. He began his writing career as a reporter and feature writer for the *New York Post* in 1939.

He began professional free lance writing in 1940. Mr. Bloom is one of the few free lance writers that was able to support himself by writing articles. He served with the United States Army in World War II, and was one of the first teachers at Biarritz-American University where he taught journalism.

Throughout his long career as an author, Mr. Bloom wrote more than 600 articles and several books. His books include *Money of Their Own*, *The Man Who Stole Portugal*, *The Trouble with Lawyers*, *Rogues to Riches*, *The Thirteenth Man*, and *The Brotherhood of Money*. He received a Fiftieth Anniversary Medal from the Graduate School of Journalism, Columbia University, and a Special Award from the American Society of Journalists and Authors in 1985.

Series Description

The Murray Teigh Bloom Papers are arranged in 4 series:

Series I. Research Files, 1820-1985. 20.05 cubic ft. (44 document boxes and 1 slim document box). Arranged alphabetically. Includes magazine and newspaper clippings, pamphlets, press releases, notes, and speeches.

Series II. Correspondence, 1939-1984.

Subseries 1. Business correspondence, 1939-1984. 1.8 cubic ft. (4 document boxes). Arranged alphabetically. Between Mr. Bloom, publishers, magazine editors, researchers, and other writers.

Subseries 2. Fan Mail, 1941-1979. 1.35 cubic ft. (3 document boxes). Arranged chronologically. From readers of Mr. Bloom's articles and books.

Subseries 3. Personal Correspondence, 1942-1977. .7 cubic ft. (1 document box, 1 slim document box). Arranged chronologically. Between Mr. Bloom and his acquaintances regarding current events, their families, and story leads.

- **Series III. Manuscript Files, 1938-1983.** 5.2 cubic ft. (11 document boxes, 1 slim document box). Arranged alphabetically. Drafts of articles, books, and plays by Mr. Bloom.
- **Series IV. Printed Material, 1950-1984.** .45 cubic ft. (1 document box). Arranged alphabetically. Articles by Mr. Bloom.

Scope and Content

The Murray Teigh Bloom Papers, 1820-1985, contain extensive files regarding lawyers and the United States legal system, Wall Street and money markets, the small world of bank note production, counterfeiting, and white slavery. Mr. Bloom does meticulous research for his articles and book. The research files contain information about a wide variety of subjects concerning abuses within the United States legal system, social services, and social problems in the American culture.

The correspondence files, 1939-1984, provide insight into the working life of an author. The fan mail includes a very large number of favorable letters concerning Mr. Bloom's best selling book, *The Trouble with Lawyers*.

The manuscript files, 1938-1983, and the printed material, 1950-1984, are useful to anyone interested in Mr. Bloom's writings.
