About the Award

The American Heritage Center awards an annual cash prize to recognize excellence in graduate student research using primary sources from our collections. This award encourages innovative scholarship across all disciplines while highlighting the diverse materials available at the AHC.

What qualifies: Projects in any format—research papers, creative writing, exhibits, podcasts, websites, digital projects, art installations, etc.—that meet two criteria:

- Created for academic credit.
- Based substantially on research using AHC materials (manuscripts, archives, rare books, photographs, maps, audio recordings, film, video, etc.).

How to Apply

Submission Process:

- Students may self-nominate OR faculty may nominate students.
- Each faculty member may submit one project per year.
- All submissions must include a faculty letter of recommendation.

Required Materials:

- The completed project (or active link for digital projects).
- Faculty recommendation letter (electronic format acceptable).
- Process paper (for non-traditional research papers only): 500-1000 words explaining which AHC sources were used, how they contributed to the project, and your research and creative process.

Selection and Award Terms

A committee of AHC faculty and staff will evaluate submissions based on quality of research, innovative use of primary sources, and overall excellence.

Award Conditions:

- Winner receives \$500 with no restrictions on use.
- Student agrees to allow AHC to use the project for educational outreach (this requirement may be waived for projects intended for formal publication).
- Winner will be announced in June 2026.
