

Major Matthew Clark is the Operations Officer and Assistant Professor of Aerospace Studies for the Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps Detachment 940 at the University of Wyoming, Laramie, Wyoming. He is responsible for recruiting, training, and evaluating the detachment's Reserve Officer Training Corps cadets for initial accession into the United States Air Force as commissioned officers.

Major Clark commissioned in the Air Force in 2004 through the ROTC program at Utah State University, earning his Bachelor's degree in Political Science. He later earned his Master's degree in Military Operation Art and Science through the Air Command and Staff College.
