
Thesis: Reinstatement of a Dead Day before Homecoming


1. Whereas Homecoming is a significant and important event for students,
2. faculty, staff and alumni of the University of Wyoming as well as for the
3. growth of the institution; and whereas the time required to produce
4. quality homecoming activities is monumental on the part of students,
5. staff and alumni; and whereas the academic community has not supported
6. the students in their efforts to create this elaborate production; and
7. whereas in years past when a "Dead Day" had been scheduled, there was a
8. greatly reduced time conflict on the part of students, staff and alumni;
9. and whereas Dead Day was given up in 1979 with the promise that classes
10. would begin after Labor Day and that was not realized; Be it resolved by
11. the Student Senate of the Associated Students of the University of
12. Wyoming that they recommend the reinstatement of a Homecoming Dead Day
13. to be the Friday immediately prior to the Homecoming weekend.
