Title: Campus Bicycle System

Introduced: March 1, 1984

Thesis: Support for campus bicycle paths, regulation and parking

1. Whereas the University of Wyoming has participated with the City of Laramie,
2. Albany County, and the State Highway Department in the preparation of an
3. organized plan for the travel of bicycles on campus, but has not yet
4. implemented an organized system for the use of bicycles on campus, and
5. whereas some bicycle racks are provided on campus, but there is no systematic
6. access for their use, and whereas students, faculty <sup>and</sup> *staff* administrators enjoy
7. traveling to campus on bicycles during periods of good weather, and whereas
8. the dangerous and discourteous campus bicycle use including bicycles chained
9. to handicapped rails is unregulated, and whereas there is presently
10. insufficient bicycle parking space available on campus, and whereas the
11. campus police have expressed concern for their ability to enforce bicycle
12. use and travel on campus and their ability to assist owners in retrieving
13. stolen and unregistered bicycles, and whereas it is the policy of the
14. University of Wyoming to promote good citizenship, health and safety for
15. students and to enhance energy conservation, aesthetic values, and community

16. relations; therefore be it resolved by the Student Senate of the Associated
17. Students of the University of Wyoming that the University of Wyoming
18. adopt, implement, and finance the University of Wyoming Bicycle System
19. Improvement Proposal.
