## SENATE RESOLUTION #1543

Title: Opposition to Faculty Senate Bill 183 and request to the Administration for the disapproval of Faculty Senate Bill 183.

Introduced: October 8, 1986

Thesis: The +/- grade scale proposed by Faculty Senate Bill 183 is inferior

and should not replace the current grade scale.

Sponsor: Thomas Tighe

1. Whereas Faculty Senate Bill 183 as enacted would require the implementation

2. of a twelve step +/- grade scale; and whereas ASUW Senate Resolution #1521

3. resolved unanimous opposition to Faculty Senate Bill 183; and whereas

4. sufficient doubt exits that a +/- scale would allow more precision of

5. grading: and whereas the +/- scale reduces the practical differentials of

6. grading so as to jeopardize fairness; and whereas a substantial proportion

7. of the University of Wyoming faculty oppose or do not support the +/-

8. scale; and whereas the +/- scale has been recommended to the University

9. Administration without addressing the need to modify honors and probation

10. requirements; and whereas the fairness of grading would be compromised by

11. voluntary faculty use allowing students taking identical course work to be

12. graded by two different grade scales; and whereas informed students do not

13. generally support a change in the grade scale; and whereas the +/- scale is

14. punitive towards superior students by allowing a grade of "A-" but not

15. "A+"; and whereas the current grade scale is proven efficient in determining

16.student work performance; and whereas the proposed +/- scale is substantially

17. flawed in the precise and fair evaluation of student academic progress;

18. and whereas the flaws contained in and associated with Faculty Senate

19. Bill 183 have not been properly addressed; and whereas alternate grade

20. scales may provide superior student evaluation in relation to Faculty

21.	Senate Bill 183 and deserve consideration; and whereas the Student Senate		
22.	has exhausted efforts to work for a revised +/- system in conjunction		
23.	with the faculty through the Scholarship Standards Committee and via an		
24.	ad-hoc committee consisting of faculty and student representatives; and		
25.	whereas Faculty Bill 183 was passed by the Faculty Senate without a		
26.	quorum, and is therefore invalid; therefore be it resolved by the		
27.	Student Senate of the Associated Students of the University of Wyoming,		
28.	representing the interests and welfare of the Associated Students of the		
29.	University of Wyoming, and with regard to the academic welfare of the		
30.	University of Wyoming as a whole, that we oppose the implementation of		
31.	Faculty Senate Bill 183 and urgently recommend the Administration		
32.	disapprove the enactment of Faculty Senate Bill 183 based on the		
33.	disadvantages cited in this resolution and therefore that copies of this		
34.	resolution shall be forwarded to Tom Mattheus, Dean of Students, Robert		
35.	Houston, Acting Vice President for Academic Affairs, James Hurst,		
36.	Associate Vice President, Student Affairs, for their respective consider-		
37.	ations and actions, and President Donald Veal for his consideration of		
38.	approval or disapproval of Faculty Bill 183.

## A BILL TO CHANGE THE GRADING SCALE AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MYONING

1 2 3	MEREAS, the present five-grade scale of A,B,C,D,F, though sanctioned by tradition, is imprecise and hardly adequate in gauging student progress, and		
4 5 6 7	MARKEAS, the large qualitative differences existing, for example, between work meriting a low C and a high C, or that meriting a low B and a high B, as well as other existing divergences in quality within the other grades, are presently uneasily accomplated under a five-grade scale, and		
8 9 10	MEREAS, this five-grade scale at times has the effect of not properly rewarding students for academic work performed, and is therefore unfair to them, and		
11 12 13	WHEREAS, a .3 deviation for pluses and minuses best answers our educational needs and adds new, fair, and practical differentials to the grading, and		
14 15 16	MEREAS, such an enlarged and diversified scale would permit a fairer and more exact evaluation of student performance than the present five-grade scale, therefore, be it		
17 18 19	ENACTED by the Faculty Senate of the University of Wyoming that the following grade scale and the grade points accompanying it replace the present five-grade scale of A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, F=0:		
20 21 22	A - 4.0 $C - 2.0$ $A - 3.7$ $C - 1.7$ $B + 3.3$ $D + 1.3$
