Title: University-wide Cooperative Education Program

Introduced: March 1, 1988

Thesis: This establishes that the ASUW is in favor of a university-wide

cooperative education program.

1. Whereas the Co-op Program offers professional experience before

2. graduation, an alternative to classroom learning, career exploration, and

3. earnings to defray college expenses; whereas co-op students will alternate

4. periods of paid employment with periods of classroom education; whereas

5. jobs are directly related to academic majors, and the program is

6. structured to be an integral part of the educational process; because of

7. the high cost of recruiting the number of companies interviewing on campus

8. at UW has gone down by 65% over the last three years and 45% over the last

9. year alone, thereby making the co-op opportunity even more important

10. for future permanent placement; whereas national college expenses are

11. raising at an average of 6% per year and the amount of financial aid

12. is decreasing, many students who are otherwise qualified, drop out of

13. college due to economic reasons could rely on the co-op income for

14. continuation towards the completion of their degrees; whereas the almost

15. total lack of professional job opportunities in Laramie and the

16. surrounding area coupled with the overwhelming rural nature of the

17. state it is even more important than most campuses in the US; whereas the

18. trial period like a co-op placement can also help tremendously in the

19. cultural transition of our undergraduates coming from rural backgrounds

20. to the professional jobs in the large metropolitan areas; be it resolved

21. that ASUW supports and desires a campus-wide co-op program.
