Title: Teaching Evaluation Program Upgrade Resolution

Introduced: November 8, 1988

Thesis: Support a new teaching evaluation program which will have more

effect on tenure and retention of faculty and which would inform

students of the results of teaching evaluations.

Sponsor: Ken Worley

1. Whereas the current teaching evaluation program is non-standard across

2. colleges and departments; and whereas an ASUW student survey conducted

3. in the 1987-88 Academic Year showed that over half the students do NOT

4. think that current teaching evaluations are taken seriously by depart-

5. ment heads, deans, or administrators; and whereas many of the current

6. teaching evaluation methods are very subjective and virtually impossible

7. to summarize or correlate; and whereas students are not informed of the

8. results of any evaluations to guide them in selecting courses and/or

9. instructors; be it resolved by the Student Senate of the Associated

10. Students of the University of Wyoming that a new teaching evaluation

11. program be instituted which: 1) is, for the most part, objective in

12. that the major portion of the evaluation can be accomplished on a com-

13. puter-readable form for easier compilation (for example, ratings on a

14. scale from 1 to 10); 2) includes two distinct sections, one for course

15. evaluation and the other for instructor evaluation, which would be com-

16. piled separately; 3) is standard across both departments and colleges

17. so that all instructors and courses could be compared according to the

18. same standards; 4) does not exempt the instructor from evaluations due

19. to tenure; 5) allows for disclosure of all results of teaching

20. evaluations to students at minimal cost (perhaps in pamphlet form); and

- 21. 6) affects faculty promotion, tenure, and retention. Further be it
- 22. resolved that if the University of Wyoming's administration does not take
- 23. any action toward this goal by the end of spring semester 1989, this
- 24. topic be made a major goal of the summer internship attended by the
- 25. President and Vice-president of the 1989-90 ASUW Senate.
