Establishment of a Senator-At-Large Position

for the Defeated Vice Presidential Candidate

- T. WHEREAS, the Constitution of the Associated Students of the University
- 2. of Wyoming currently provides a senator-at-large seat for the
- 3. defeated presidential candidate in the general election;
- 4. WHEREAS, the Constitution currently does not provide a senator-at-
- 5. large seat for the defeated vice presidential candidate;
- 6. WHEREAS, the previously stated system serves an injustice to both
- 7. the senate and the defeated vice presidential candidate, as the
- 8. candidate's valuable experience is not being utilized by the senate;
- 9. THEREFORE, be it enacted by the Student Senate of the Associated
- 10. Students of the University of Wyoming that the following amendment
- 11. be added to the Constitution as Article VI, Section 3, Subsection D.
- 12. to read:

There shall be one senator-at-large who shall be the defeated vice presidential candidate in the preceding ASUW general election.

All\_references to the number of elected senators shall be changed from 31 to 32 where applicable in the Constitution.

## **ENACTMENT**

This amendment shall become effective upon a two-thirds vote of the ASUW Student Senate; a majority vote of the ASUW members voting; and approval by the Trustees of the University of Wyoming.

Upon final approval, this measure shall be retroactive to include the 1991 general election.
