1. WHEREAS, the governor issued an Executive Order imposing

- 2. stringent monetary restrictions for all state agencies; and
- 3. WHEREAS, a tuition increase is a proposed option in offsetting
- 4. the mandated budget reductions for the University; and
- 5. WHEREAS, approximately \$1.13 million will be generated by a
- 6. 9.5% Trustee proposed tuition increase for the 1992-93
- 7. academic year; and
- 8. WHEREAS, an additional tuition increase of 15% is being
- 9. proposed by the Board of Trustees for the 1993-94 academic
- 10. year; and
- 11. WHEREAS, the economic needs of students must be taken into
- 12. consideration when proposing increases in tuition; and
- 13. WHEREAS, a recent student survey showed a majority of
- 14. students believe revenues generated by a tuition increase
- 15. should be used to better the academic departments at the
- 16. University; and
- 17. WHEREAS, the potential exists for the University of Wyoming
- 76. to increase its external fund raising efforts;
- 19. THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Student Senate of the
- 20. Associated Students of the University of Wyoming that it
- 21. supports a tuition increase not to exceed 10% per year for

- 22. residents and non-residents for the 1992-93 and 1993-94
- 23. academic years; and
- 24. THEREFORE, be it further resolved that revenues generated
- 25. from tuition increases be directed toward the retention and
- 26. enhancement of the academic departments at the University of

- 28. THEREFORE, be it further resolved that the University of
- 29. Wyoming increase its activities in pursuing other areas of
- 30. revenue enhancements.
