1. WHEREAS, it has been proposed that the University of Wyoming

- 2. alter its class schedule in a manner such that classes would
- 3. begin on the half-hour rather than the hour (i.e. classes would
- 4. begin at 7:30 a.m. rather than 8:00 a.m., 12:30 p.m. rather
- 5. than 1:10 p.m., etc.); and
- 6. WHEREAS, starting classes at 7:30 a.m. may cause significant
- 7. problems such as increases in child care costs for non-
- 8. traditional students with children enrolled in Albany County
- 9. Public Schools (children attending public schools cannot arrive
- 10. on school grounds until 7:40 a.m. at the very earliest); and
- 11. WHEREAS, an additional hour of classes each day would increase
- 12. the length of finals week by as much as half a day; and
- 13. WHEREAS, at this time the benefits derived from implementing
- 14. a proposal starting classes on the half-hour do not outweigh
- 15. the disadvantages and overall hindrance to student success that
- 16. may result; and
- 17. WHEREAS, the current dilemma regarding classroom and lab
- 18. utilization is a problem of convenience rather than an actual
- 19. lack of space availability;
- 20. THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Student Senate of the
- 21. Associated Students of the University of Wyoming that we do not

22. support the implementation of a class schedule that is based on 23. starting classes on the half-hour.
