1 WHEREAS, there is a large number of student organizations on

- 2 campus; and
- 3 WHEREAS, the Student Senate of the Associated Students of
- 4 the University of Wyoming foresees a greater number of
- 5 student organizations seeking representation through ex-
- officio positions on the senate; and
- 7 WHEREAS, a fair and consistent method for selecting ex-
- 8 officio representation needs to be implemented;
- THEREFORE, be it enacted by the Student Senate of the
- 10 Associated Students of the University of Wyoming that
- 11 Article 2, Section 6, Subsection B of the "ASUW By-Laws" be
- 12 amended to read:
- 13 "B. All University Recognized Student Organizations
- seeking an ex-officio position on the ASUW Student Senate
- must have that position approved by the Constitution
- 16 Committee and further approved by the ASUW Student Senate by
- 17 a 2/3 majority. Student organizations seeking an ex-officio
- 18 position must exhibit all of the following qualifications:
- 19 1. The organization must provide a diverse array of co-
- 20 curricular activities including cultural, international,
- 21 athletic, and/or student life programs.

22	2. The organization must utilize educational
23	opportunities which promote growth and involvement enriching
24	daily life.
25	3. The organization must be a University Recognized
26	Student Organization, but special exemptions may be granted
27	for the representative bodies of the University, faculty,
28	and staff.
29	4. The organization must demonstrate inadequate
30	representation by the existing ex-officios and senate."
31	THEREFORE, be it further enacted that the existing ex-
32	officio positions currently held are not exempt from the
33	above process.
