1. WHEREAS the University of Wyoming's "Outdoor Adventure Program" serves

2. several purposes:

3. A) It provides an opportunity for students, faculty, and staff unfamiliar with

4. our great Wyoming outdoors to experience the mountains, plains, and

5. waterways through organized trips and events led by qualified

6. individuals.

7. B) It serves to provide these members of our University community with the

8. opportunity to gain the necessary knowledge, skills, and confidence

9. needed to exercise sound judgment when venturing into the outdoors.

10. C) Outdoor Adventure Program has the potential to strengthen the

University community as a whole, by offering opportunities for positive

social interaction combined with educationally valuable experiences; and

13. WHEREAS the Outdoor Adventure initiative has a significant responsibility in

14. its mission to introduce members of the University to the outdoors in safe and

15. educationally valuable outdoor experiences; and

16. WHEREAS many of the Program's organized trips and events will entail the beauty

17. and the potential dangers of the alpine environs; and

18. WHEREAS potential dangers should be realized in any outdoor venture; and

- 19. WHEREAS the kinds of equipment participants introduced through the Outdoor
- 20. Adventure Program play a central role in helping understand and comprehend
- 21. outside environments; and
- 22. WHEREAS first-time users to Laramie's environment should have access to essential
- 23. equipment needed for safe travel regardless of season; and
- 24. WHEREAS responsible measures should be taken to ensure both the education and the
- 25. safe use of equipment for first-time participants.
- 26. THEREFORE, be it enacted by the Associated Students of the University of Wyoming
- 27. that upon funding, the Outdoor Adventure Pilot Program will be considered an ASUW entity
- 28. for a probationary period which will end after one(1) year has elapsed; and
- 29. THEREFORE, be it further enacted by the Student Senate of the Associated Students of the
- 30. University of Wyoming that at the end of the probationary period, the Student Senate directs
- 31. the Outdoor Adventure Pilot Program Steering Committee to submit to the Student Senate
- 32. a written report containing, at minimum, the following information:
- 33. 1. The year-to-date income statement of the Outdoor Adventure Pilot Program
- 34. 2. A summary of the activities of the Outdoor Adventure Pilot Program
- 35. 3. The number of students who have participated in the Outdoor Adventure Pilot Program
- 36. 4. Any other information requested by the Senate.
- 37. And;
- 38. THEREFORE, be it further enacted by the Student Senate of the Associated Students of the
- 39. University of Wyoming that at the end of the probationary period the Student Senate may,
- 40. through formal legislation, make the Outdoor Adventure Program a permanent ASUW

41. Entity, extend the probationary period, or revoke the Outdoor Adventure Program's 42. status as an ASUW Entity, and; 43. THEREFORE, be it further enacted by the Student Senate of the Associated Students 44. of the University of Wyoming that if the Senate fails to act at the end of the probationary 45. Period, the Outdoor Adventure Program's status as an ASUW Entity will be revoked, and; 46. THEREFORE, be it also enacted by the Associated Students of the University of Wyoming 47. that the \$11,352 currently allocated for a salary be transferred from the ASUW 48. administration salary line to the ASUW Outdoor Adventure Program property line 49. (see addendum); and 50. THEREFORE, be it further enacted that the transfer of \$11,352 is restricted to 51. property purchases by the Outdoor Adventure Program.
