1. WHEREAS, the Student Senate of the Associated Students of the University of
2. Wyoming (ASUW) is elected to represent the entire student body; and
3. WHEREAS, it is the advice of the Vice President of ASUW that senators
4. establish a minimum of one office hour per week; and
5. WHEREAS, ASUW would like to establish a more intimate relationship with
6. the student body as a whole in offering an interface for questions, comments,
7. and general feedback.
8. THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Student Senate of the Associated Students
9. of the University of Wyoming provide an opportunity to solicit students'
10. questions, comments, and general feedback in the Wyoming Student Union; and
11. THEREFORE, be it further resolved that the Senate solicits the above
12. mentioned on alternating Wednesdays and Thursdays of each school week; and
13. THEREFORE, be it further resolved that these days be known as "What Do
14. You Want Wednesday" and "Thinking Thursday"; and
15. THEREFORE, be it further resolved that one hour of service could be substituted
16. for one office hour for the senators who participate on these days; and
17. THEREFORE, be it further resolved that the senators provide this on a trial basis
18. for the fall and spring semesters of 2000-2001, effective immediately; and

19. THEREFORE, be it further resolved that the planning of these days be

20. sponsored by the Student Relations and Student Issues Committees.
