Addendum A

- A. A candidate for any ASUW elected position must meet the following requirements:
 - 1. He/she must be an ASUW fee paying student.
 - 2. He/she must have and maintain a minimum 2.5 cumulative grade point average as an undergraduate and a minimum 3.0 cumulative grade point average as a graduate or professional student, or a 2.5 if the program does not require it.
 - 3. He/she must have completed not less than thirty (30) hours of University credit at the beginning of the academic year of his term of office.
 - 4. He/she must have completed not less than twelve (12) of those hours at the University of Wyoming unless completed an undergraduate degree at the University of Wyoming.
 - 5. He/she must submit an application provided by the Elections Committee.
 - 6. All candidates for Senator will run individually.
