ADDENDUM A

Article IV Resignation Policy

- Section 1. Acceptable forms of resignation shall be as follows:
 - A. A senator wishing to resign their Senate seat shall present written notification of resignation to the Vice President.
 - B. A senator may announce their resignation during a regular senate meeting during Open Forum. Following the announcement, the resigning senator shall present written verification of the resignation to the Vice President within two (2) business days. If no written verification is provided, the announcement as recorded in the minutes will stand for an appropriate and formal resignation.
