- 1. WHEREAS, Associated Students of the University of Wyoming (ASUW) Town
- 2. Hall Meetings (THM) were designed to meet the specific need of providing
- 3. ASUW outreach to students on campus; and
- 4. WHEREAS, THM are no longer required, needed or are meeting the need they
- 5. were designed to meet; and
- 6. WHEREAS, THM have had a minimal return on investment based on the cost
- 7. to administer the meetings and low attendance since their conception (see
- 8. Addendum A); and
- 9. WHEREAS, members of ASUW and the THM Committee could more effectively
- 10. and efficiently use their time to serve specific constituencies; and
- 11. WHEREAS, ASUW has several other outreach events for students including
- 12. ASUW Wednesdays, Student Mocktail Hour, and the Holiday Humdinger; and
- 13. WHEREAS, small THM may reflect poorly on ASUW and may negatively affect
- 14. ASUW's relationships with individual colleges; and
- 15. WHEREAS, the most successful THM have occurred when individual colleges
- 16. request, plan, promote, and facilitate college-wide meetings.
- 17. THEREFORE, be it enacted by the Student Senate of the Associated Students of
- 18. the University of Wyoming (ASUW) that Article II, Section 10, Subsection A,

- 19. Item 11 be stricken from the ASUW By-Laws; and
- 20. THEREFORE, be it further enacted that if a college contact and senators within
- 21. an individual college agree to host a Town Hall Meeting with their college
- 22. because of constituent interest, they may do so with the help of the Director of

23. Public Relations.
