Addendum A

THE BY-LAWS ASSOCIATED STUDENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF WYOMING

ARTICLE VIII

Services and Programs

- Section 1. All services and programs funded by the ASUW shall be placed in one (1), and only one (1), of the following categories:
 - C. Other Programs and Services
 - i. The following groups operate either in an advisory capacity to ASUW, have little need for consistence in meeting times and locations, or have available meeting space which they ought to be encouraged to utilize. These include:
 - a. Associated Students Technical Services (ASTEC)
 - b. United Multicultural Council
 - c. A.L. Lupton Financial Literacy Program
 - d. Freshman Senate
 - e. Students' Legal Services Students' Attorney Program
 - f. Non-Traditional Student Council
 - g. Panhellenic Council
 - h. Interfraternity Council
 - i. ECO
